Pastor's Column





This week's pastor's column about the Knights of Columbus is reprinted from a previous Good News Messenger.

Understanding the Knights of Columbus

I always found the Knights of Columbus to be a confusing organization in the Church. Most people are familiar with the distinct ceremonial hats, capes and swords of the Honor Guard. However, I was surprised when I found out the majority of Knights are not in the Honor Guard.

Beginnings

Fr. Michael McGivney was a diocesan priest in New Haven, Connecticut. He formed the Knights of Columbus at St. Mary's Parish in 1882 as a "parish men's club" intended to perform charitable works and, in the event of a member's death, to provide an annual stipend to any widow and children he left behind for their livelihood. Since Catholics were (and are) forbidden from belonging to Masonic groups, Fr. McGivney wanted men to experience fraternity and social connections in faith-filled settings. Eventually, the Knights of Columbus developed into one of the largest charitable and insurance organizations in the Catholic Church. The Venerable Michael McGivney is now on the road to canonization as a Catholic saint.

Organization

The Knights of Columbus is a large organization with over 1.9 million members led by a *Supreme Knight and the Supreme Officers* in New Haven, Connecticut. The organization is divided into *state councils*, and the states councils are divided into *districts*. Each district has several *local councils*, each representing a *parish* or *multiple parishes*. Assumption-Mattese, Seven Holy Founders and Our Lady of Providence make up the Fr. Griffin Council #3586, which is part of Missouri District 39.

Councils

Each local council has a Grand Knight and officers with various responsibilities. The council meets monthly. They have dinner together, pray the Rosary and discuss participation in charitable activities or the distribution of charitable funds.

There are odd holdovers from the 1800's when the Order was founded; occasionally councils hold initiation ceremonies for new members and for advancements through the ranks, but they are not really essential parts of the Knights. They are more of a reminder of the Order's history. There are four degrees of membership, each permitting members greater responsibilities in the leadership of the Order. Each degree focuses on a virtue: charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism, respectively.

Faith in Action

The Knights of Columbus have a centralized, national program to guide charitable activities. The program is called *Faith in Action* and is made up of four categories: Faith, Family, Community, and Life. Each category has specific activities. Councils perform a certain number of activities in each category to merit the "Columbian Award." The goals of *Faith in Action* are to help each Knight live his faith in the home and in the parish, strengthen the Catholic Church, and support worthy charities.

Care for Member's Families

The Knights of Columbus still care for the families of their members. Although not required of members, Knights have access to the "highest-rated" life insurance, long-term care insurance, and investment opportunities.

Joining the Knights

The Knights of Columbus provide men who want to do good work for Christ, the brotherhood they need in order to do more than they could do alone. Any Catholic man who practices his faith and is at least 18 years of age can join the Knights. If you have been a Knight and would like to become active again, see Tim Hessel, Grand Knight, or Fr. Keller, Chaplain. The Fr. Griffin Council meets on the Second Tuesday of the month at Seven Holy Founders Parish but, as you know, the council is very active at Assumption and Our Lady of Providence as well. RECLAIMING MY CATHOLIC FAITH

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

Priests have a very specific role within Catholic life and in particular, within Catholic worship. Priests bring the Sacraments to the people of God "In Persona Christi", meaning, "In the Person of Christ." So at every Mass, Christ Himself celebrates the Mass and the priest simply stands "in His person."

In other words, the priest visibly represents the invisible reality that Mass is the continuation of Christ's saving death on the Cross and glorious resurrection. God uses the human priesthood to communicate to us, in the Mass, the graces of these divine events.

At Mass, Christ Himself offers His Body and Blood not only to the Father from the Cross, but He also offers Himself to the believer in the form of Holy Communion. Therefore, it is most fitting that the priest who offers the Mass "In the Person of Christ" distributes the Body and Blood of Christ to the lay faithful who present themselves for Holy Communion.

Although ideally, only the priest celebrant at Mass distributes Holy Communion, when the number of communicants is large, other priests may assist with distribution. If there are not enough priests and deacons, men who are instituted acolytes (usually seminarians and deacon candidates) may assist.

If there are still not enough priests, deacons, and acolytes to help, then the pastor can appoint members of the laity as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion.

The way that the diocese in the United States uses Extraordinary Ministers is not exactly how the Vatican envisioned their use. The practice of providing Communion under Both Kinds at large Masses was not foreseen by Vatican guidelines. In fact, Communion under Both Kinds is anticipated for more solemn moments like at the profession of vows for a nun or religious brother or for a bride and groom at their wedding Mass. In some occasions, when the congregation is prepared and able to receive from a single chalice, then it may be offered. However, American bishops decided on their own to encourage Communion under Both Kinds at as many Masses as possible. This requires a large number of Extraordinary Ministers.

While the practice itself is not wrong, certain things need to be clear.

- 1. One receives both the Body and the Blood of Christ even when one receives only the Sacred Host.
- 2. The priest celebrant is the preferred minister of Holy Communion.
- 3. The laity only assist when necessary.

Question for Reflection:

- 1. Do I show respect for the Holy Eucharist?
 - 2. Do I show respect for the priesthood?
- 3. Do I want to hurry the reception of Communion or do I take time to thank God for the gift of His Son, Jesus present in the Holy Eucharist?

Kolbe Retreat Prison Ministry

Join us October 3rd through October 5th as we administer one of our Lord's Corporal Works of Mercy by serving as a team member on a **Kolbe Retreat** in Palestine Texas. We are looking for 3 or 4 men from the Assumption ACTS community to serve alongside 25 Texans from St. Rose of Lima parish out of Houston

What is a Kolbe retreat? Simply stated, a Kolbe retreat is a form of ACTS retreat given to residence of a prison. A Kolbe retreat (named after St. Maximilian Kolbe) has several elements of an ACTS retreat such as Personal Talks, Table Sharing, Foot Washing, Reconciliation, Mass, and Agape, given in a prison environment. As such, team members are required to have served on at least one ACTS retreat team.

Palestine Texas is located about 2 hours southeast of Dallas and is home to several Texas state prisons.

Kolbe Prison Ministries have been in existence in Texas since 2009 and formed out of the ACTS organization when an of-

fender at a Texas prison requested an ACTS retreat be given in the prison. You can read more about it at the following web site: www.kolbeprisonministries.com

Time commitment is less than an ACTS retreat as there are only 3 "formation" meetings prior to the retreat. We will be attending these meetings via conference call to St. Rose of Lima a few weeks prior to the retreat.

The cost of the retreat is \$100 per team member. This money is used to provide meals for the team and for up to 66 offenders for the duration of the retreat.
