



Pastor's Column Fr. Thomas Keller

The New "Faith in the Home" Project

Today, maybe more than ever, parents need help handing on the Catholic Faith to their children. The influences of a sinful world surround us, and without solid Catholic family customs, God can be forgotten in our daily life. A lot of families want to live their Catholic Faith, but many parents feel like they have to stretch outside their comfort-zones to do it. We want to make it easier.

Fr. Keller, Miss Valerie Stringer, our Director of Elementary Religious Education, and Miss Cecilia Detwiler, our Coordinator of Evangelization are creating a program called "Faith in the Home" to help parents adopt treasured family traditions and accept specific challenges to live the Catholic Faith at home on a regular basis. The aim is to help parents live the Catholic Faith and help children to receive the Catholic Faith.

Faith in the Home will celebrate saints, introduce different forms of prayer, revive old family traditions and lay out challenges for families to live their faith. Faith in the Home will provide content for the whole family to experience; we will offer "deeper" content for moms and dads so that they will begin to feel like the experts on religious subjects.

Some challenges will be for families to do in their homes and some will be events hosted here at Assumption. Fr. Weber and I would love to be a part of some experiences in the homes! Opportunities to invite us will be built into the program.

Faith in the Home will integrate three technology platforms to deliver this program:

- 1) The resources will be archived on our parish *website*, <u>assumptionstl.org/faith</u>. Everything will be easily accessible and you will be able to share it with family and friends.
- 2) We will share the content via a new *Public Facebook Group*, <u>Assumption Faith in the Home</u>. This way, parents can share their experiences through posts or photos and interact with each other as a little online Assumption Parish community.
- 3) Research shows that faith is something handed down by BOTH parents, each in their unique way, so, *Faith in the Home* will use *Flocknotes*, which is a text and email platform, to communicate and to link you to new *Faith in the Home* content!
- Dads if you would take out your cell phones and text FAITHDAD (one word) to 84576.
- Moms if you would text FAITHMOM (one word) to 84576.

Flocknote automatically creates groups to link content that can be sent to all parents or specifically to moms or dads.

There's a lot of great Catholic content, specifically for Catholic dads and moms, out there on the internet! We want to make sure Assumption families have opportunities to grow in their Faith. The stronger the parent's faith, the stronger their children's faith will be.

RECLAIMING MY CATHOLIC FAITH

Blessings

A blessing is a gift of God's grace. Blessings originated in the Old Testament. An example is when Aaron, the first high priest, raised his hands to bless the people. Blessings increase the holiness of the recipient. Blessings also protect the recipient or blessed object from evil.

The pope imparts certain special blessings, known as the Apostolic Blessing and the Papal Blessing. A plenary indulgence is granted to those who receive the Apostolic Blessing known as the Ubi et Orbi after the pope's election and annually at Christmas and Easter. It is granted to those who attend the *Ubi et Orbi* in person at St. Peter's Square, or who even watch the live broadcast on TV or over the Internet. Ordinarily, a simple Papal Blessing was imparted at the end of the Pope's Mass, after his weekly audience, or after his public Angelus. There is a tradition of asking for a Papal Blessing to be imparted to a loved one on the occasions of Baptism, First Communion, Confirmation, Marriage, Ordination, Religious Profession or secular consecration, or on Anniversaries (10, 25, 40, 50, & 60 years) or birthdays (18, 50, 60, 70, 80, 90, 100 years of age) Catholics can request the parchment commemorating the blessing at www.elemosineria.va to be given to a loved one as a gift.

Cardinals, Archbishops and Bishops grant special blessings known as Pontifical Blessings. These special blessings are offered at the end of their Masses. Bishops of a diocese offer a special Pontifical Blessing that grants a plenary indulgence on Christmas and Easter and on another occasion of the prelate's choosing.

One is most likely to receive a blessing from a priest. He offers a blessing at the end of Mass, over meals, and for many other occasions. As part of the "Last Rites", each priest is delegated permission to impart a special blessing known as the "Apostolic Pardon" to a dying individual to remit temporal punishment due to sin. Priests are able to offer unique blessings for specific Rosaries, Miraculous Medals, and Brown Scapulars. Also, priests can offer the blessing/exorcism for St. Benedict Medals.

Newly ordained priests offer a special blessing known as a "First Blessing." Customarily, it is given to the new priest's parents, family, and friends after his ordination and First Mass, but it can be given to any Catholic for up to a year.

A priest or deacon can offer a solemn blessing with the Blessed Sacrament simply known as "Benediction." A priest or deacon can also offer blessings over religious articles called "sacramentals." These include crosses and crucifixes, images of Christ, the Blessed Mother, or saints. A priest or deacon can bless everyday objects like homes and vehicles.

Sometimes, we say an object is "blessed" by touching it to a holy place. In the Holy Land it is common to touch a Rosary or other objects to the place of Christ's birth in the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem and to the places of His death and resurrection in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem. Similarly, if an object is touched to the reliquary of a saint, it becomes considered "blessed" and becomes known as a "third class relic."

Parents and godparents can give a blessing to their children. This is done during the Rite of Baptism but it can be a part of every Catholic family's daily traditions. This is usually done before the child goes to bed. The parent gives the blessing by tracing his or her thumb or finger on the forehead of the child, often followed by a kiss on the forehead.

When we enter or leave a church or chapel, there is an opportunity to bless ourselves with Holy Water. Holy Water can be taken home in a small bottle and one can bless oneself or one's home with the Holy Water anytime.

Questions for Reflection:

- 1. Do I miss opportunities to receive God's blessings in my life?
- 2. Are my Rosary or other religious articles blessed?
 - 3. Do I thank God for the blessings in my life?

Invitation from the Associate Pastor Fr. Weber



Dear Assumption Parishioners,

When I entered the seminary after high school, during my first days of orientation, something that was repeatedly stressed was that seminarians ought to be men deeply rooted in a daily habit of prayer. As a seminarian, I was required to make a daily holy hour in chapel and was highly encouraged to pray throughout the day as well. I remember that it made sense to have these requirements of prayer, but at the same time, I was a little intimidated by them. During my high school years, I learned how to pray by attending youth ministry and other parish events, but I had never had such a high expectation put on me as this one! However, while the seminary put this expectation forward for me, they also helped me understand how I could not just fulfill it, but come to love it as well.

One way of praying that I was introduced to in the seminary goes by a few names— The Liturgy of the Hours, the Divine Office, and the Breviary. These three names all refer to the same thing: a set of daily prayers and readings based around the psalms which are said at different times throughout the day. Since being introduced to the Liturgy of the Hours, it has become an integral part of my life. As a priest, one of the promises I took at my ordination was to pray the Liturgy of the Hours. However, over the years, it has become not just an obligation, but something that roots and sustains me during my day.

The Liturgy of the Hours is not simply a prayer for priests and religious, however. I would love to introduce the practice of praying the Liturgy of the Hours to a wider group of people here at Assumption. For those interested in learning to pray these prayers, I will be holding an informational meeting on September 19 at 7 p.m. in the lower level of the rectory. If you cannot attend this meeting but are interested, please feel free to email me at weberr@assumptionstl.org and we can make other arrangements.

Who is RCIA for?


1. Unbaptized


