Pastor's Column

Fr. Thomas Keller

The Boy Scouts of Assumption's Troop 169 have a great tradition of supporting the parish. One of the ways they support Assumption is through Eagle Scout projects. As a Boy Scout progresses toward the rank of Eagle, he has an opportunity to design, fundraise, gather materials, and organize volunteers to construct the project. Assumption has benefitted from many years of Eagle Scout projects.

A few years ago, a very ingenious Assumption Boy Scout designed and installed a camera and microphone that transmits our Masses via the internet.

Anyone with an internet connection can go to assumptionlive.com and participate in Holy Mass.

There are many ways to watch Mass. Other parishes have started live-streaming their Masses too and, of course, for many years EWTN has broadcast daily Mass from Birmingham, Alabama several times a day on their cable station. EWTN also broadcasts Papal Masses from the Vatican and during the pope's visits to various nations.

Once in a while it is good to revisit the conditions for participating in Holy Mass transmitted via a form of media.

First, it is important to remember two things:

1. Watching Mass on TV or over the internet does not satisfy the obligation to attend Holy Mass.

2. One is released from the obligation to attend Holy Mass if:

- a) one is sick or homebound due to age, or illness,
- b) inclement weather makes it dangerous to attend Mass.
- c) one travels, but it is a good thing to attend Mass if it is available
- d) one is required to work in a profession that demands attendance on Sundays, although if a Mass is offered at a convenient time and at a reasonable distance, the obligation still stands, even if it is a sacrifice to attend.

So the service of broadcasting or live-streaming Mass is not intended to satisfy one's obligation to attend Holy Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation or their vigils.

However, many Catholics love the Mass and feel its loss when they are not able to attend due to declining health. They are encouraged to watch the Mass as it is being celebrated. In doing so, they are able to receive the same graces offered at that moment to those physically present at Mass. At Assumption, we try to live-stream all our regularly scheduled Masses so parishioners can participate from home at a convenient time and hopefully at their favorite Mass.

We also keep the Masses archived for a while so parishioners who wish to hear a specific piece of beautiful music again, or re-listen to a gloriously inspired homily are able to do so, but unfortunately, watching the entire Mass at a different time is not the same as participating live.

So, I encourage you to share our livestream's website, assumptionlive.com, with anyone (they don't need to be parishioners) who is homebound and explain to them the importance of watching it live. Also, we are grateful for all our scouts (Eagle Scouts and Girl Scout Gold Award recipients) who have enhanced our campus with their many gardens and other practical projects.

[Important Announcement Regarding "Protecting God's Children"](#)

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. **Everyone ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required to register in the new system. This includes all clergy, employees and volunteers who are currently in compliance and those new to service.** All new registrants will need to attend a Protecting God's Children workshop. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. In addition, everyone will register for an updated background screening, view two online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct.

[Important Announcement Regarding the Upcoming Diaconate Ordination of Mr. Michael Thompson](#)

Canon 1029 - "After all circumstances have been taken into account in the prudent judgment of the proper bishop or the competent major superior, only those should be promoted to orders who have an integral faith, are motivated by a right intention, possess the required knowledge, and enjoy a good reputation, good morals, and proven virtues, and other physical and psychological qualities which are appropriate to the order to be received."

The above is what Canon Law says about one who petitions the Archbishop to be ordained a Deacon. Canon 1029 make it clear that becoming a Deacon is not about fulfilling requirements, it is about an integrated lifestyle of love for Jesus Christ and of service to the Church.

Following the age-old custom of the Church, as maintained by Canon Law (Canon 1051, paragraph 2), it is my privilege to announce publicly that Mr. Michael Thompson, a member of Assumption-Mattese parish, is a candidate for the major order of Sacred Diaconate, to be conferred on June 6, 2020, at 10:00 a.m. at the Cathedral Basilica.

Anyone who knows any reason why this candidate should not be ordained is bound to disclose this immediately.

Please join me in prayer for Mr. Thompson that his ordination will be a time of extraordinary grace and abiding peace. -Fr. Thomas Keller

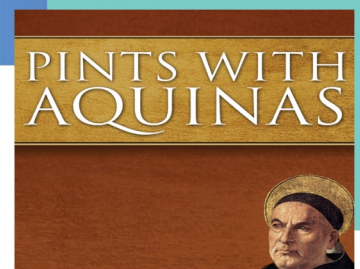
