Senior Ministry Update

Assumption Senior Ministry began with a request from the Parish Council in 2014. Since then, a special committee of parishioners researched different programs and set a direction for Assumption. Laura Benson moved from Adult Faith Formation to develop our Senior Ministry program in 2016. Since then, we started regular events for seniors including an annual retreat, monthly speakers with luncheons, First Friday brunches and weekly exercise classes and small group activities. One major milestone was when a parishioner donated the money for the Assumption Shuttle providing opportunities for parishioners to attend Mass and other events more easily.



We want to thank Laura for all her hard work developing our thriving Senior Ministry.

She has created an amazing program. We hate to see her go.



But at the same time, we want to welcome Lynn Ewy and Stacey Macko. They will be splitting Laura's duties and building on her successes. Lynn recently worked at Regina Cleri, the retirement home for Archdiocesan priests. She took great care of the priests there and she is looking forward to working

with our seniors at Assumption. Stacey is a parishioner at Assumption and is a retired elementary educator, but her patience and compassion makes her perfect for the job. Thank you Laura, and welcome Lynn and Stacey!

Preserving Our Heritage

Since Fr. Seper's time, there has been a committee of parishioners who help the pastor understand and manage maintenance and facility issues in the parish. Believe it or not, in the 13 years of seminary training, we didn't get a lot of direction about replacing roofs, St. Louis County building codes, and the mechanics of an HVAC system. That's all on-the-job training. But my bachelors degree in Philosophy, Masters in Divinity and Masters of Arts in Sacramental Theology helps me ponder the eternal truths in my free time.

The Maintenance Committee meets monthly to discuss all facility issues with the pastor and our parish maintenance supervisor. They are a tremendous resource for the parish. Not only are they able to identify problems and find solutions, but they also are proactive in caring for the facilities to extend the life of individual buildings and systems and they predict when it is necessary to replace something before it causes greater expense or difficulties.

Together with the Maintenance Committee, Fr. Seper put together a special collection to assist the parish with maintenance issues. This collection is known as *Preserving Our Heritage* and in the past, I have used it to fund major facility projects recommended by the Parish Council and/or Maintenance Committee.

This year, we have two major issues to address:

- 1. To replace the primary components of the **Fire Detection and Alarm System** in the school and Parish
 Center. Unfortunately, we are in a difficult position. Parts
 of the current system are so old that they cannot be
 replaced without updating the entire thing. The problem
 is that if we wait until one of the parts breaks, we might
 be without a fire detection system for several weeks.
 During that time, the fire marshal will not permit us to
 use these buildings. Therefore, it is to our advantage to
 schedule the replacement of the obsolete parts during a
 break, in order to avoid a major interruption in our
 services. Estimated maximum cost is \$14,493.
- 2. To install a **disabled access assist device** on one set of doors to the Parish Center. These devices have proved to be very helpful to seniors with canes, walkers or individuals in wheelchairs who use them to enter the church. Since the Parish Center is the second most visited location on our campus after our church, installing them will make these facilities senior and disabled friendly. Estimated maximum cost is \$2,400.

Would you consider making a sacrificial donation to help us keep Assumption facilities safe, secure and accessible?

Archdiocesan Lenten Regulations

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

(John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (February 26, 2020), all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (April 10, 2020) are days of abstinence (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onwards. On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.
