

The Gospel story of Christ raising Lazarus from the dead is a beautiful account that teaches the power of faith, hope, and charity. These virtues are essential in allowing us to participate in the life of God. Christ states that he is the resurrection and the life and that those who have FAITH in Him will never die but will live forever. Those who HOPE in the Lord will not be disappointed but will look forward to eternal life with a fervent desire for heaven. Hope enables us to trust in God's promises and to rely on His grace and not our own efforts. Finally, the story shows the LOVE Jesus had for His friend Lazarus. Jesus loves the Father perfectly and all His creation for the love of God. The theological virtues are infused by God into our souls to make us capable of acting as God's children and of meriting eternal life (CCC 1813). As we approach Holy Week, let us pray for a deeper awareness of these glorious virtues that are present in us when we are in the state of grace.

Well, here we are. It's been a full week since the shelter at home started. The parish is operating with a skeleton crew; just one person to help with the important office work and two others to care for our campus facilities. Poor Fr. Weber is wandering around somewhat disoriented and bored—of course that's nothing unusual—and pretty soon I'm going to break the news to him that we are closed. However, the grade school is still active over the internet. Mrs. Sykora and our teachers are doing an amazing job shifting from traditional classroom instructions to online leaning. And our prayers are with our families who have had to make huge lifestyle changes to become "instant homeschoolers." People are asking me how I'm doing. I'm still trying to be reasonable and industrious as my Danish genes drive me to do, and I'm am an only child and a natural introvert, so aside from worrying about what the world is going to be like when this is over, I'm fine. I hope all of you are coping with a surreal world too. I'm praying for you every day. I know there is a lot of suffering out there. Although as of this writing, there are relatively few positive cases of Coronavirus in St. Louis, everyone is suffering financially, emotionally, and many are suffering spiritually with the loss of easy access to the sacraments. Here at Assumption we are trying to help any way we are able.

Our live-streamed Masses have had some glitches as YouTube, which hosts our videos, has been overloaded. Hopefully, our faithful tech volunteers have smoothed out the issues and you are able to catch us for daily or Sunday Mass, Rosary at noon, or Friday Stations of the Cross at www.assumptionstl.org

Holy Week and Easter

As you have probably heard, Holy Week and Easter liturgies cannot be celebrated publicly this year. This is an unprecedented move by the Pope and bishops. As unbelievable as it may seem, the shepherds are just trying to protect the flock from an unseen wolf that will devour, if given the chance. Pray for them, it is unnatural and difficult for priests to encourage the faithful to stay away from Masses. However, the church is still unlocked from 6 a.m.-5:30 p.m. for prayer.

We will still bless palm branches on Palm Sunday and allow you to pick them up later. We will make Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday Liturgies available online. I'm considering linking everyone to the Cathedral Basilica's Holy Week live-streamed liturgies. If we cannot be united in person, we might as well be united as an Archdiocese. I want to do something safe but special for Easter. We'll see. There's no page in the Pastor Playbook on this one.

Angel's Arms Foster Care Success!
