Pastor's Column Fr. Thomas Keller

Assumption Update

Even though very few St. Louis area residents are suffering directly from Coronavirus, everyone is affected. The experiences range from isolation and mental fatigue to job loss and financial uncertainty. Everything about our lives seems infected by this highly contagious disease.

It's a tale of two Assumptions right now. The side of Assumption people normally see is closed down. The biggest change is the lack of public Masses. Many parishioners have expressed extreme sadness and pain by the loss of regular attendance at Mass. Yet at the same time, the priests have not missed a single scheduled Mass, and we are still praying with you and for you. Surprisingly, Assumption has expanded our reach during this time of isolation. We've received kind emails thanking us for the live-streamed Masses and Rosary from Catholics in Albuquerque, New Mexico, Chicago, Illinois, Merrit Island, Florida, and Popular Bluff, Missouri.

Many parts of our nation's economy have been severely crippled, and churches are essentially not-for-profit service and education-based businesses. Revenue is down and Churches often have a lot of employees. Assumption employed over 100 people prior to the government mandated shut down. While many people think of Assumption as a couple of priests and some Catholic school teachers, we employ full-time and part-time employees in pastoral ministries, grade school education, early learning education and day care, office staff and kitchen staff. We have maintenance and custodial staff and administration to oversee and support all these different operations.

Some of the staff are working harder than ever. Consider the teachers, who, even though their classrooms are empty, must complete the semester and teach the required material each child must know by the end of the year. However, all the tools and resources they normally use must be transmitted to individual homes over the internet for families who are themselves

completely overturned by effects of the pandemic. Our Catholic School teachers are working really hard at this time. Several of our other pastoral ministries, including our Youth and Senior Ministries have adapted to connecting with people over the internet and by phone. These connections, whether academic or pastoral, are very important to preserving our parish as well as helping one another.

While some employees are working harder than ever, other employees have had to be laid off and some are permanently released, as we don't think things will return to normal right away. Many of our employees are struggling to get by and we are helping as we can. We received permission from the Archdiocese to use our reserve savings for emergency cash for salaries and other bills. Some of our major projects are already underway and we have signed contracts to see them through. Other projects we are putting on hold as we evaluate the possibility of delaying them or scaling them back.

While we all want to be released from the government-mandated shut down, and we can't wait to celebrate the end of this epidemic, and we hope we are all spared of the illness, we are very concerned that some parishioners and many neighbors will be permanently affected by the accompanying economic disaster. We do not know what school and ELC enrollment will be next fall or how this will affect our future Sunday Collection.

This time may be a blessing for parishioners as this shut down drags on. Maybe the many distractions we embraced through sports and entertainment, relationships we take for granted, clutter we fill our lives with, and the sinful habits we may have embraces will fall away. Maybe new priorities will emerge – maybe our Catholic Faith, our families and the communities that support us will emerge as new priorities. Once again, maybe we will feel a sense of urgency as we pray and we will grow to trust in God all the more.

Devotional Altar

When the local, state and federal governments began responding to the COVID-19 Coronavirus epidemic, many people were plunged into a sense of uncertainty and many began to worry about their health, their employment and the well-being of those they love. I quickly realized we could offer some help during this time, not only by livestreaming liturgies (which we have done for years) and reaching out to people at home online and by the phone (as our staff is doing from home), but we could create a central place of prayer.

On March 19th, the Feast of St. Joseph, I erected a little devotional altar in the church with a crucifix and a statue of Our Lady of Fatima. Near it is Holy Water for you to take home and a table with prayers and the latest copy of the bulletin. Of course, hand sanitizer is on the table.

But the purpose of the altar is prayer and so if you know someone who is infected with COVID-19, or who works in the health care industry and needs our prayers, or is suffering because of the epidemic in some other way, you can stop by church and place

their names on the altar or email me their names and I will print and place them there. Please email the names to kellert@assumptionstl.org.

As the priest approaches the sanctuary for Mass, he will pass those names and be reminded to lift up their intentions. And I invite you to remember those included on the altar in your prayers, especially your daily rosary and ask Our Lord to heal all who suffer at this time.
