Safety Procedures for Attending Mass During this Time at Assumption (5/16/2020)

- 1. The obligation to attend the Sunday Mass remains lifted indefinitely. Livestreamed Masses will continue at www.assumptionlive.com. Anyone who is ill or showing symptoms of the Coronavirus, who has been in contact with someone with COVID-19, who is vulnerable due to preconditions, or over 60 years of age are asked to remain at home and participate via livestream.
- 2. Based on Assumption's occupancy, only 125 people are permitted per Mass until further notice. In order to reserve a place for you and your family, please go to www.assumptionstl.org to sign up or please call 314-487-7970 during office hours, M-F 8:30 a.m.- 4:30 p.m. If your preferred Mass is full, please consider one of our other Masses. Since there is no obligation to attend Sunday Mass, some parishioners may want to try a weekday Mass. Parishioners should sign-up for every Mass they wish to attend, even weekday Masses.
- 3. To maintain "physical distancing," masks are required for all children 2 and above and for all adults. We have a limited supply of masks for those who do not have their own. Individuals/families are asked to sit at least six feet from others and every other pew will be available for seating. Church doors will be propped open, holy water and hymnals have been removed, and hand sanitizer is available throughout the church. At our fuller Masses, an usher may instruct you where to sit. Following Masses, we ask that some parishioners remain behind to apply sanitizer to the pews and other surfaces for the next congregation.
- 4. Monitored baskets will be placed around the church for offertory envelopes and cash donations. Online giving is encouraged. Go to www.assumptionstl.org to sign up.
- 5. The Offertory Procession, Sign of Peace and Communion Under Both Kinds will be omitted.
- 6. Communicants are asked to approach the priest/deacon in a single file line leaving six feet from the person ahead of you. When you arrive at the priest/deacon, temporarily remove your mask, carefully receive Holy Communion in the hand and replace the mask after receiving. Making a Spiritual Communion remains a prudent option.

Reopening Updates

The parishes in South County are grouped by the Archdiocese into a "deanery." The dean and pastor of Mary, Mother of the Church, Fr. Chuck Barthel, has helped the South County pastors communicate regarding the reopening of churches last week and we see that most parishes have similar trends.

South County parishes consistently reported approximately 40-60 people per Mass last weekend. That is what we had here, too. It seems parishes are finding the sanitizing process to be easy to accomplish. The priests are hoping that more people feel safe coming back soon, but we are glad things reopened to manageable crowds and easy preparations for each Mass.

Of course, Assumption had an additional problem of a broken AC unit last week. Right now, our parish Maintenance Committee is deciding whether repair or replacement is the best route. Regardless, it is going to be expensive.

The Archdiocese continues to encourage parishioners to "sign-up" in order to avoid crowding at a single Mass when more people return. Also, even though there are no missalettes or hymnals in the pews yet, you can still access all of the music and readings for weekend Masses online and print them out to bring with you to Mass. Everything you need to sign up or access a copy of the music & readings is at www.assumptionstl.org.

As we begin to return to "normal" liturgies at Assumption, our Lectors and Altar Servers are encouraged to volunteer for duties again. I think it is going to be a long time before the *Sign of Peace* is reinstated, and a lot of priests wonder if Communion from a common chalice will ever be offered again.

If you haven't been by Assumption, our maintenance staff and volunteers have been hard at work making the campus beautiful for the summer. They have been power washing, painting, mulching and gardening socially distant) for weeks. The campus looks great! The Parish Center (gym) is being painted, too.

Some parts of Assumption are "waking up" after the government mandates shutdown. Today, (Pentecost) several of our RCIA members will be received into the Faith as we administer an Adult Baptism and the Sacrament of Confirmation and First Holy Communion. The Early Learning Center is opening on Monday at slightly more than 50% of previous enrollment and our summer camp is actually a little larger than last year's enrollment. Our Youth Group is beginning with outdoor activities this week.

The Archdiocese has not given us permission to open the facilities for meetings yet.

A few weeks ago, Assumption rolled out a fundraiser to help offset the loss in revenue from the decreased Sunday Collection and the cancelation of several Fish Frys and the Parish Picnic. We raised over \$30,000, however, we are still in need of over \$100,000 to make up for the shortfall. Your donation will help Assumption remain a vibrant parish with its many ministries and apostolates.

If you want to do something to express your gratitude for "frontline workers" during this pandemic, we have attractive signs available after Masses and at the parish office for a donation of \$10.

Assumption is planning a giant Rummage Sale on August 8 in the Parish Center. If you have a lot of stuff to get rid of, this is your chance! See the Good News Messenger as more details become available.

We need lots of help in order to keep the inside of the church as safe, social-distanced, and sanitized as possible for each congregation that pours in for Mass. Positions we need:

Mass Captains- 1 person to supervise the Pestilence Response Team and pitch in where needed

Social Distancing Guides- 3 people to direct Mass attendees to open seats and instruct them on our safety guidelines

Mask Angel - 1 person to provide masks as needed to those who do not have one, as well as move a cart with spray and masks to the front of the cry room

Basket Brigade - 6 people to help with the collection baskets

Sprayers - 8 people to spray down a couple of pews with disinfectant following Mass to prepare for the next congregation

How to Safely Wear and Take Off a Cloth Face Covering

WEAR YOUR FACE COVERING CORRECTLY

- Wash your hands before putting on your face covering
- Put it over your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin
- Try to fit it snugly against the sides of your face
- Make sure you can breathe easily
- Do not place a mask on a child younger than 2.





USE THE FACE COVERING TO PROTECT OTHERS

- Wear a face covering to protect others in case you're infected but don't have symptoms
- Keep the covering on your face the entire time you're in public
- Don't put the covering around your neck or up on your forehead
- Don't touch the face covering, and, if you do, clean your hands

FOLLOW EVERYDAY HEALTH HABITS

- Stay at least 6 feet away from others
- Avoid contact with people who are sick
- Wash your hands often, with soap and water, for at least 20 seconds each time
- Use hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available





TAKE OFF YOUR CLOTH FACE COVERING CAREFULLY, WHEN YOU'RE HOME

- Untie the strings behind your head or stretch the ear loops
- Handle only by the ear loops or ties
- Fold outside corners together
- Place covering in the washing machine
- Wash your hands with soap and water



Cloth face coverings are not surgical masks or N-95 respirators, both of which should be saved for health care workers and other medical first responders.
