

Pastor's Column

Is the End in Sight?

Area pastors are reporting that more Catholics are returning to Mass after the long lockdown. We have seen a lot of parishioners returning to Assumption, especially families with children and some of our beloved seniors. Hopefully, as the number of daily new coronavirus cases continues to plummet and vaccination rates increase, we will be able to return to normal soon. As St. Louis County and the Archdiocese give new guidelines, we hope to be ready to adjust.

Vaccine Morality

As you know, there are many ethical and moral concerns regarding modern medicine and medical practices. The pandemic and the resulting vaccines have led to many ethical and moral concerns. One of the concerns is the use of embryonic stem cell lines in the production and testing of the vaccines. Unfortunately, this is all too common in the pharmaceutical world. It is probable that many common medications used every day have been derived in one way or another from the stem cells harvested decades ago from the remains of an aborted baby. The Pfizer and Moderna vaccines have a low connection to these stem cells; however, the new Johnson & Johnson vaccine and the upcoming AstraZeneca vaccine used aborted fetal tissue stem cells in their development. Therefore, the U.S. bishops caution that the Johnson & Johnson and AstraZenica vaccines should be avoided unless there is no alternative. Unfortunately, practically speaking, no one reading this will have much of a choice which vaccine is offered to them, so I assume the bishops are making this known largely to make Catholics aware of the widespread problem.

Why is using stem cells derived from aborted stem cells problematic? Aside from the terrible injustice of intentionally ending a pregnancy because the child is unwanted, using the human remains of someone who did not give their consent to be experimented with or have their living cells utilized is morally wrong. Catholic bishops are correct to point out that, while we are eager to return to normal, and grateful for medical advances, these things should be accomplished without exploiting human remains of unwilling participants or profiting from the terrible practice of abortion. The Church is not opposing the return to normalcy, but we are raising our voices that the remains of aborted children should be put to rest and that new avenues should be taken to produce medicines.

Attention Delmar Gardens South Volunteers

Back in February the residents and staff of Delmar Gardens South received the COVID-19 Moderna vaccine. Since then, they have been COVID-free. We are hoping to begin providing Wednesday Masses and Sunday Communion Services at Delmar as soon as enough or volunteers are ready to return. If you are a Delmar volunteer, please contact Deacon Dave Schaefer at 314-487-7970 ext.1254 so we can begin making some concrete plans to return Holy Mass to the residents as soon as possible.

Church Etiquette

In the meantime, since there is still some risk to vulnerable parishioners, please be mindful of others. As more people are returning to Mass, those who commonly sit on the end of the pews are asked to be mindful others may want to sit in your pew. It has been noted that for months, three or four people to a pew has been sufficient to accommodate everyone, but now, while half the pews are still roped off, we need to be mindful of those who do not have a place to sit. Please continue to social distance, but welcome others into the pew with you.

In Memoriam

Many parishioners pass away each year, and each of them contributed to the life of the Church in their own way, but sometimes an individual dies who had made a major impact on the parish and we all owe them our gratitude. Mr. Don Grant, a parishioner for 56 years, passed away last week. Don and his wife, Marlene, have been extremely supportive of Assumption parish and school. Before Don died, he and Marlene established a memorial scholarship fund to honor their son, Brett, who died in 2016. Their love of Catholic Education will be shared with the children of Assumption for many years to come. Please remember Don in your prayers.

Kenrick Seminarians

This year, it has been more difficult to get to know our Sunday Seminarians because quarantines at Kenrick interrupted the schedule, but thankfully, they have been back to the regular schedule since Christmas. However, Austin Sudkamp has decided to return to his home in Springfield, Illinois. You can support the Assumption Grade School and Early Learning Center through our new gift card program! You can order popular gift cards at **ShopwithScrip.com**.

There's TWO ways to pay:

<u>Checking account</u>—the cost is 15 cents for the entire transaction whether a \$10 card or a \$2,000 card is purchased. Less expensive than the cost of a check! Best deal is to purchase multiple cards at once. No extra charge. Fifteen cents for entire order.

<u>Credit card</u>—the cost to the buyer is 2.6%. Keep in mind the rewards of the credit card will still be earned while Assumption School will earn the rebate.

ADVANTAGES of this program:

Mobile App—Planning to do some remodeling, appliance purchasing, or lawnmower purchase? Try doing your price comparisons online or by visiting the stores, and then purchase a gift card for the store you want online as you are ready to check out. The gift cards are sent immediately to you. Use the mobile app "RaiseRight Fundraising by ShopWithScrip". Using the app, a gift card can be purchased while standing in line to pay for the meal or item.

Secure—Gift cards can be stored in a phone or in your email. While a physical gift card can be lost or stolen, an online gift card has the advantage of remaining securely stored in your account on your phone or in your email.
