Veiling of Sacred Images

I'm not sure anyone knows exactly when the veiling of devotional images during that last two weeks of Lent (Passiontide) began, and there's no "official explanation" why it is done. However, for anyone who has celebrated the liturgy in an environment with veiled images, it speaks to the solemnity of the moment as we approach the Sacred Triduum. The statues or pictures which are used for public devotion are veiled, but not necessarily every piece of liturgical art, so the images that are veiled are meant to be the beloved images that foster piety in the faithful.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal encourages the veiling of images in all churches: "In the Dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church

covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil (Fifth Sunday of Lent)."

The practice takes on a special significance as the veil of the crucifix is ritually removed during the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday revealing the Crucified One. It also adds to the celebration of the Easter Vigil when the saints are once again revealed as the lights are turned on for the singing of the Exultat.

Blessed Palms

The final Sunday of Lent is known as Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion. As the Church's liturgy developed, Christians wanted to "relive" the experiences of Christ's Passion and Death. So, the liturgies of Holy Week took on different characters depending on the day. On the Sunday before Good Friday, Christians re-enacted the triumphant entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem.

In the Holy Land, Christians met outside of Jerusalem with cut palms and carried them as the deacon read the Gospel of the Lord's Entry into Jerusalem. Then the clergy led the congregation as they processed into the city for the celebration of Mass at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre.

In some places in Germany and France, Catholics took cut flowers and branches and created outdoor paths for the priest to carry the Blessed Sacrament. Children would sing Hosanna to the Son of David and all would bow down and kiss the ground as the priest carrying the Sacrament passed by.

Today, each person holds a palm branch for the reading of the Gospel of the Lord's Entry into Jerusalem. But the Gospel of the Lord's Passion is also read on this day and the palm becomes a bitter reminder how we welcome Jesus as a king only to crucify Him by our sins. Blessed Palms that are taken home should be placed behind a crucifix or statue. The Blessed Palms also become fuel for a fire the following year to make ashes for Ash Wednesday.

Tre Ore on Good Friday

The Gospel of John indicated that Jesus hung upon the Cross from Noon until he died around 3 p.m. Here at Assumption, we have Stations of the Cross at Noon and the priests will hear confessions from Noon until 3 p.m. on Good Friday. This year we are filling in the rest of the time with a beautiful old custom called the Tre Ore (meaning Three Hours). Occasionally, throughout the afternoon, one of the deacons will read short Gospel passages where Jesus speaks from the Cross. This is known as the "Seven Last Words of Jesus." As the three-o'clock hour approaches, the deacon will give a blessing with the Relic of the True Cross, and at 3 p.m. we will pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. This is a very informal devotion, and you are welcome to come and stay as long as you like, but for whomever is in the church between Noon and 3 p.m., there will be meditations on the crucifixion.

Good Friday Holy Land Collection

Every year the Church has a special collection for the Catholics who live in the "Holy Land." The Holy Land is found in the State of Israel, the territory of Palestine and the Kingdom of Jordan. The Catholics who live in these places are descendants of early Christians who lived in that area or they are descendants of Christians who, out of great piety, moved to the Holy Land during the Crusades. These Christians are the living connection we have with the places that Jesus, Mary and other Biblical figures knew. These Christians live in communities that are predominantly Jewish or Muslim. Unlike here in the United States, religion defines much of what is open to individuals and being a minority makes life difficult for Christians in the Holy Land. Unfortunately, Covid-19 has stopped all pilgrimages to the Holy Land and as a result, left many Christians there without incomes. It has also left the Shrine Churches empty and without a source of revenue. Please consider a generous donation to support our Catholic brothers and sisters in the Holy Land. They protect the heritage we imagine each time we read the Bible.
