

Pastor's Column Fr. Thomas Keller

Happy Anniversary!

Assumption Early Learning Center will turn 20 years old on April 29th! Way back when Monsignor Dempsey was pastor of Assumption, the parish discussed starting a new Catholic Education apostolate, but it was Fr. Blake who opened the AELC with just 4 children. At the time, many archdiocesan parishes were beginning to add Pre-K programs as feeders to their grade schools. But the Assumption Early Learning Center was envisioned as more than just a childcare program that lets the children play all day; it was meant to be a place that deliberately engages the children's physical, emotional, educational and even spiritual needs.

Mrs. Shelley Michael is the AELC director, and she has led the program since its very beginning. Her vision for engaging very young children on every level of development has shaped the program and made it the success it is today. Together with assistant director, Mrs. Julie Coughlin, the dedicated AELC staff cares for 110 children, ages 6 weeks to 5 years, year-round.

Oftentimes nowadays, both parents work, and so this program is a great service. Some single-income families choose the AELC to give their children the advantages of socialization and structure. Children are formed to develop critical-thinking abilities, cultivate social skills, and play creatively. In a world where children often get sucked into iPads at very young ages, the AELC works to develop their imaginations and motor skills. The staff works closely with parents to help children reach their potential at every stage of development. The AELC children learn to pray, participate in our Catholic liturgies, and recognize our sacramentals.

The AELC begins with infants. Some of the children in our grade school started with us at 6 weeks old! My best friends each year always seem to be the toddler class, since they always seem really happy to see me. Life as a pastor is often isolating and bereft of affirmation, but when you walk through a door and everyone jumps up and down and says, "Fr Keller's here!", you call them friends!

The AELC was originally located in the former convent (now called the Salesian House). Now the AELC is integrated into the Grade School building in order to give parents a greater sense of belonging to the Assumption Family, to allow for additional space, and to consolidate meal programs and other services. Annually, about 80% of our AELC Pre-K graduates go on to become Assumption kindergarteners. This is one big reason our grade school has seen such a large increase in enrollment in recent years. The seamless curriculum from the AELC to the grade school gives students an advantage in those early years. The unified leadership between our principal, Mrs. Sykora, and Mrs. Michael, our AELC director, gives parents confidence that their children are receiving the best care and education possible.

The AELC also gives the parish an opportunity to reach out to young families and invite them to become more involved in parish life. Many of the young families we see at Mass on Sunday are AELC families. We always have to remember that the primary reason parishes offer educational programs and children's activities is so families can come to know Jesus Christ, become living members of His Body, the Catholic Church and be happy with Him forever in heaven!

Assumption Parish has a lot of excellent programs, let's get ready to celebrate one of the best.






Blood Drive Recognition
