Pastor's Column Fr. Thomas Keller

New Shrine

Last Fall, a grade school physical education class was in the gym. An errant ball hit the large marble crucifix that hung on the wall above the bleachers. A broken arm fell to the bleachers below. Fortunately, no one was seated nearby. The marble would have certainly seriously injured someone or worse. In retrospect, it is astonishing that the crucifix has been there since 1997 and it had never been broken before. Unfortunately, now that we know it can be broken, the marble image of Jesus had to come down.

The crucifix came from a closed convent in North County. It is a beautiful piece of art and could not be replaced today. So, the best course of action was to repair and preserve it. The only problem is that it is too big to hang in most indoor locations on campus and we had to stay away from areas where children play. I asked around for ideas and in the end, we decided a large exterior wall to the north side of the Rectory made the best (and safest) location to place it.

While the marble statue was being repaired, cleaned, and sealed, I got some parishioners involved to design and build a little shrine area. I think it will turn out beautifully! They designed an area with a German-style roadside shrine look to it. When fully complete, it will have a small altar under the crucifix for our annual Eucharistic Procession and to serve as a little place people could leave flowers if they are so inclined. We will add some landscaping and a few new trees to give it a beautiful surrounding.

The project is in memory of Motz Gapsh, a long-time parishioner who recently passed away. Motz was very active at Assumption and was always a great joy to be around. Please remember the repose of his soul in your prayers and remember Nel, his beloved wife in your prayers, too.

Thanks to Mike Meyer and our faithful maintenance committee members who took this idea and created something incredible. When you are out for a walk on campus, stop by and say a prayer anytime.





<u>Dynamic Catholic, Alive! - The Most Holy Body and</u> <u>Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)- The Blessed Sacrament</u>

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi is celebrated on the first Sunday after the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast began with St. Juliana, a young Belgian nun in the thirteenth century, who received in prayer an inspiration for a feast that would celebrate and promote the gift of the Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist. This feast would eventually spread throughout the province, continent, and world. Corpus Christi and its accompanying procession with the Blessed Sacrament, celebrating the sacrament and signifying God's presence in our world and in our lives and reminding us of our common pilgrimage to Heaven, is a prayerful and edifying act of the entire Church. As a general rule, devotions are not mentioned in the Code of Canon Law. However, because of the importance of this devotion in the life of the Church, canon 944 mentions it: "When it can be done in the judgment of the diocesan bishop, as a public witness of the veneration toward the Most Holy Eucharist, a procession is to be conducted through the public streets, especially on the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ." On this feast we can express our gratitude for the opportunity to receive our Lord every Sunday in the Eucharist, to adore Him in prayer, and to show Him to the rest of the world in the streets of our archdiocese. archstl.org/dynamic




Glennon Sunday—June 6th!


