## Pastor's Column

### All Saints Day & All Souls Day

This year, All Saints Day is **not** a Holy Day of Obligation because it falls on a Monday. The Missouri Bishops (along with most of the American Bishops) do not hold Catholics to the obligation of Mass attendance if All Saints Day falls on a Sunday. Why not? I guess I don't know either. Let's just move on.

Regardless, we will have a 7 p.m. Mass on November 1<sup>st</sup> to celebrate All Saints Day and everyone is welcome to come join in the great solemnity.

Families today often remember the anniversary of a loved one's death. Similarly, since earliest times, the Church has remembered the anniversary dates of the martyrs. These anniversaries became known as "feast days." It is a feast day because the martyrs who voluntarily died for believing in Christ were immediately welcomed into feast of heaven, even if they were a sinner. This may explain why so many Christians were willing to die for the faith!

As the number of martyrs increased, there weren't enough days in a year to commemorate all of them, so only the most popular and important were commemorated. If you attend Mass during the week, you will know when a martyr's feast day is celebrated because the priest always wears red vestments. Some of the dates of martyrs' feast days are very ancient and they are remembered year after year for their courage to die for Christ.

After the persecution of Christians ended, the Church began adding the names of holy men and women to the calendar, even if they were not martyred. At first, the reputation for holiness was all it took for the Church to remember the anniversary of their deaths with a special Mass. Eventually, to be certain that a person was in heaven, a process began to test the theory that someone is in heaven. It is known as canonization. The Church investigates the life of a person to see if they participated in the sacraments regularly and lived a life of heroic virtue (not ordinary virtue but heroic virtue). Then, the Church waits to see if miracles are attributed to the intercession of that person. The Church's canonization process continues today with new saints being added to the calendar. In fact, there are way too many saints for all of them to be remembered on a specific day in a year.

But there are also Catholics who lived quiet lives of virtue and died in a state of grace whom no one notices. These people are in heaven too. The Church is equally as proud of the humble person who loved God and neighbor, repented from sin and grew in virtue, as it is of a well-known, canonized pope!

So, All Saints Day is set aside to celebrate the lives of **all people in heaven**, known and unknown. All Saints Day is one of the days of greatest celebration in the Church. Hopefully, each one of us will be in heaven someday to join in the eternal celebration of the saints!

But as a reminder that unlike the martyrs who instantly go to heaven after their deaths, most of us must undergo a period of purification after death in order to be "perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect." Purgatory is a place of hope, because having died in a state of grace, the soul is destined for Heaven, but it needs to be freed of the imperfections caused by sin first.

On November 2<sup>nd</sup>, we will pray for the dead at a special Purgatorial Mass at 7 p.m. All are welcome!

## Assumption Pro-Life Foundation

As we conclude Pro-Life month in October, we thank you for your prayers and the financial support provided by so many Assumption parishioners. Donations made to Pro-Life can be designated toward the Assumption Youth Group, the Assumption Pro-Life Foundation or the general Pro-Life fund which support various Assumption Pro-Life initiatives. The Assumption Youth Group sends a group of students and parents to the annual March for Life each January in Washington, DC.

Each year, the Assumption Pro-Life Foundation provides approximately \$10,000 of financial support to ten local organizations which support a culture of life.

### **Foundation revenues in 2021-2022 will once again be distributed to the following ten organizations:**

Our Lady's Inn, Birthright Counseling, Coalition for Life St. Louis, Thrive St. Louis, Good Shepherd Children & Family Services, Defenders of the Unborn, Vitae Foundation, Our Lady of Guadalupe for Life Billboards, The Archdiocesan Respect Life Apostolate, & The Pregnancy Resource Center (South County)

### **Three levels of Foundation support are available:**

- **'Gold Membership'** at the \$125 level provides significant financial support to our Pro-Life beneficiaries and entitles an individual/couple to two seats at the annual dinner, plus eligibility for the monthly and annual cash drawings
- **'Silver Membership'** at the \$75 level provides moderate support to our beneficiaries and entitles an individual/couple to their choice of two seats at the annual dinner or eligibility for the monthly and annual cash drawings
- **'Bronze Membership'** at the \$25 level provides basic yet vital support to our Pro-Life beneficiary organizations

An example of the use of general Pro-Life funds is our recent contribution of \$2,500 to the Knights of Columbus. These funds will specifically be used to help fund the Knight's Ultrasound Initiative to replace the ultrasound machine used at the Pregnancy Help Center here in South County. Ultrasound images are a key tool in helping convince expectant parents that their child is truly a live human awaiting birth. The new ultrasound machine is expected to be in service here in South County during the first quarter of 2022.

## Holy Land Olive Wood Carvings Sale in the Church Lower Level —November 6 & 7

On the weekend of **November 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup>**, a Catholic couple from the **Holy Land** will be visiting Assumption to market olive wood hand carved religious articles made by the Christian artisans in the Holy Land. With the hostilities worsening in the Holy Land and a lack of Christian pilgrims due to COVID, the outlets for the olive wood hand carvings have been closed. This has led to unemployment increasing up to 75% & many Christians leaving the Holy Land in order to find other ways to market their handiwork. However, the absence of a living Christian community is very disastrous for the Holy sites, such as the **Church of Nativity** and the **Church of the Holy Sepulcher**.

This sale is to strengthen the Christian presence in the city of **Bethlehem**, the birthplace of **Jesus**, and the surrounding areas. All proceeds will go directly to the Christian families and the artisans who are working in this type of hand carvings. They will be displaying all kinds of olive wood religious art works such as: Nativity scenes, Crucifixes, figures, rosaries, etc. These works are unique and not usually found in religious stores. These crafts make wonderful presents for all occasions, especially Christmas! Their price range is from \$5.00 to \$900.00. Checks and credit card are welcome. Please take the opportunity after Mass on **November 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup>** to check out these unique crafts and hopefully you would be able to assist our brothers and sisters in the Land of Jesus by purchasing some of these religious goods. Buying one piece will help prevent Christians from leaving the Holy Land!


## St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Store Volunteers Needed for Holiday Season!

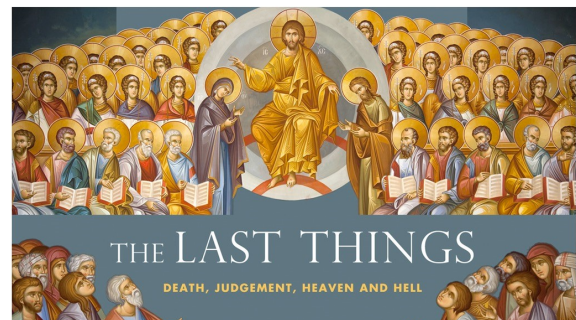
