

Pastor's Column

Archdiocese Strategic Planning - Next Steps

In last week's column, I discussed *All Things New*. If you missed it, here's a quick summary. The Archdiocese of St. Louis is beginning a multi-year strategic plan called "All Things New" to address the demographic changes throughout the archdiocese and deal with an aging and shrinking population. If you read that column, it was a wake-up call. Now that it has our attention—what do we do?

Our archdiocese needs a unified plan to address the problems that touch all parishes. A "corporate restructuring" will be insufficient, as an institutional and personal spiritual renewal are what are needed. It is important that every parishioner avoid that attitude that someone else will fix this. Your participation will be necessary. For internet-savvy people, you can go to allthingsnew.archstl.org.

First, like everything that matters in the Church, we begin with **prayer**. The phrase "All Things New" comes from the Book of Revelation. "The one who sat on the throne said, 'Behold, I make all things new.'" The passage speaks of the old order passing away and Christ renewing the earth. It is a passage about Christ transforming the world through the Church. But first, we must be renewed with prayer.

Next, we need to restructure our priorities to make a bigger difference in the lives of our children and our neighbors – believers and unbelievers alike. A word people use a lot today is "evangelization." Pope St. John Paul II spoke of evangelization almost daily in the last decade of his life. Sometimes we think an evangelist is a fiery speaker on stage, but Christ gives us all the command to "Go make disciples." John Paul II realized that we can't teach about Christ unless we offered an experience of Jesus first. This means our relationships must be humble, holy, inviting, inspirational. We may need to re-learn how to do this. We also must live lives of integrity;

meaning we live what we believe. For this, we may need a conversion of heart. We must all see ourselves as "disciple-makers."

Finally, the Church in St. Louis must redirect our resources to better serve the virtues of Faith, Hope and Charity. By working together, we can make a bigger difference in the lives of others. The greatest assets of our archdiocese – our parishes and schools – can also be our biggest obstacles. Sometimes, we keep them going because they are meaningful to me, but we forget that they were founded to make a difference in the world. By practicing stewardship through careful consolidation of our resources, we can assure vibrant families of faith scattered throughout the St. Louis area.

Next practical steps:

- 1. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, March 2, every parishioner will be asked to fill out the "Disciplemaker Index." The survey responses will provide valuable data to shape the strategic plan.
- 2. Next Fall, there will be 350 listening sessions throughout the archdiocese. Everyone will be welcome to participate a listening session.

I'm very proud of Assumption parish, as I know that many of our parishioners already embrace these values. It is evidenced by your generosity to charities, the energy to make our school, ELC and PSR a place of faith, the success of ACTS Retreats, and even the overwhelming response to attend next week's SEEK22 Conference. Many Assumption parishioners have already taken the step to become "intentional disciples" and "disciple-makers."

January 25, 2022 Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul the Apostle

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today, we celebrate a pivotal moment in the life of Church – one in which St. Paul was called by Jesus to participate in the saving story of salvation in a new way. Through St. Paul's acceptance of this call, he became one of the biggest and earliest evangelizers in our Church's history.

In St. Louis, we too are called to a new chapter in our nearly 200-year history. The model that fulfilled its mission in growing and evangelizing the Church during the last century has become archaic. Jesus is calling on us to re-energize and reshape our efforts to share His saving message.

I am excited to share with you today the official launch of our archdiocesan strategic pastoral planning initiative known as "All Things New." Under the leadership of Father Chris Martin, Vicar for Strategic Planning, we will assess every aspect of our Archdiocese and make the necessary adjustments to our ministries and supporting structures to reflect the needs of our communities for the next century. We anticipate that these adjustments will be the most sweeping changes that the Archdiocese has witnessed in its history.

"All Things New" seeks to enable a vibrant Catholic presence across every square mile of our Archdiocese by renewing the church in its mission of proclaiming the Gospel, and securing a vibrant future. Throughout this process, we will be mindful of our three-fold goals: engaging in unceasing prayer, defining and implementing a unifying vision, and ensuring intentional stewardship of the gifts that God has given to us over these past 200 years.

With St. Paul, let us begin this journey together with prayer. Opportunities for prayer and eucharistic adoration will be held throughout the Archdiocese, asking for God to enter our hearts and minds and guide our actions as we consider the best path forward.

Throughout this process, you will have several opportunities to provide feedback on your aspirations for the Archdiocese. The first of these opportunities will begin on Ash Wednesday, March 2nd, where every Catholic in the Archdiocese will be asked to take a survey. This survey, known as the Disciple Maker Index, will ask you about your beliefs, participation, satisfaction, and attitudes about your faith and your local parish experience. I encourage you to complete this survey so your voice can be heard at this important moment.

I thank you in advance for investing and serving God's one Holy Church here in St. Louis. Please know that you are in my prayers.
