

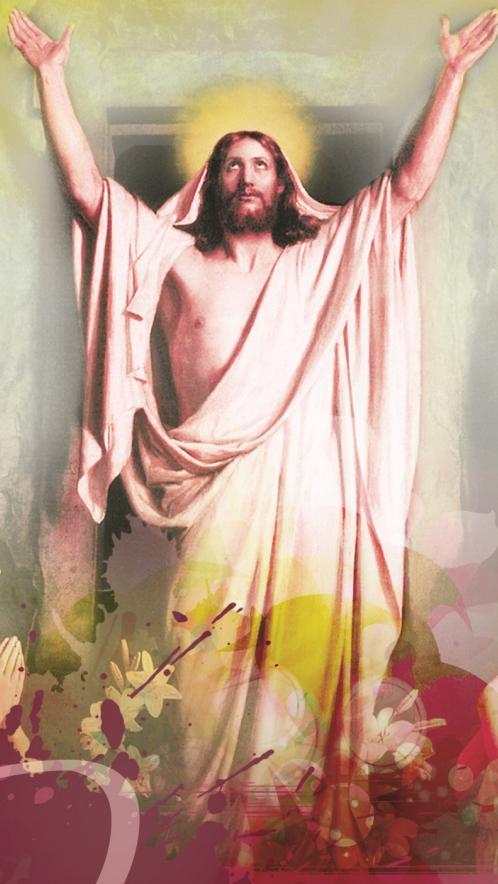

Pastor's Column

Fr. Thomas Keller

Blessed Easter!

I've told this story before, but it is always appropriate on Easter Sunday. Several years ago, I had the honor of accompanying the Archbishop of St. Louis and a group of pilgrims to the Holy Land. We went to Jerusalem and entered the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. We prayed at the Tomb of Jesus. After that beautiful experience, while I was exiting the church, two well-dressed young tourists approached me. They asked if I spoke English and they asked, "Is this where Jesus was buried?" I responded, "Yes!" Then they asked, "Is his body still there?" I was shocked by the question but politely said, "No." They looked at each other, shrugged, thanked me, and walked off. Meanwhile, the Archbishop had overheard everything and said to me smiling, "Father Keller, you are the worst evangelist ever!" We both shook our heads and continued our pilgrimage.

In my defense, I forget that the world doesn't know what we know, namely that three days after the death and burial of Jesus, the Apostles found the tomb empty and that later that day He appeared to them showing His pierced hands and feet.

But the reality is that the world is in desperate need of this news because it changes everything. Knowing that there is life after death and that these bodies of ours will experience the resurrection changes what we live for. Our priorities change and our values change. For those who believe that Christ holds the key to everlasting life, we listen closely to what He says, for His "words have eternal life." We can ask, "What must I do to have everlasting life?" What does following Jesus look like?

Following Jesus begins with Baptism and ends when we die in a state of grace. Jesus said, "Unless you are born again of water and the Spirit, you cannot enter into the Kingdom of God." And He

said, "The water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

Following Jesus is about being different. So often, Catholics, surrounded by worldly values, forget that we are meant to be different. Jesus said, "The gate is broad, and the road is wide that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But narrow is the gate and small is the road that leads to eternal life, and few find it." What makes us different? We adhere to the teachings of Christ and His Church. We strive to live the high standard of Catholic life. Jesus said, "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life, no one comes to the Father but through me." Catholic moral life is the embodiment of Christ's teachings. Jesus said, "Whatever you do to the least of my brothers, you do to me."

Following Jesus means we participate in the Sunday Mass weekly where we receive Christ, the Bread of Life. Jesus said, "I am the bread of life, he who eats my body and drink my blood has eternal life and I will raise them up on the Last Day."

Following Jesus means we find God in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Jesus said, "Come to me all you who are burdened, and I will give you rest." Often our past is filled with mistakes that burden us, but confessing our sins and hearing the priest speak the words of absolution are the greatest gift of peace. Christ gives to the Church alone the power to forgive sins. He said, "Whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

At the end of the Creed we say "I believe in the resurrection of the dead, and life eternal. Amen." This is the promise of Easter for those who believe in Jesus!

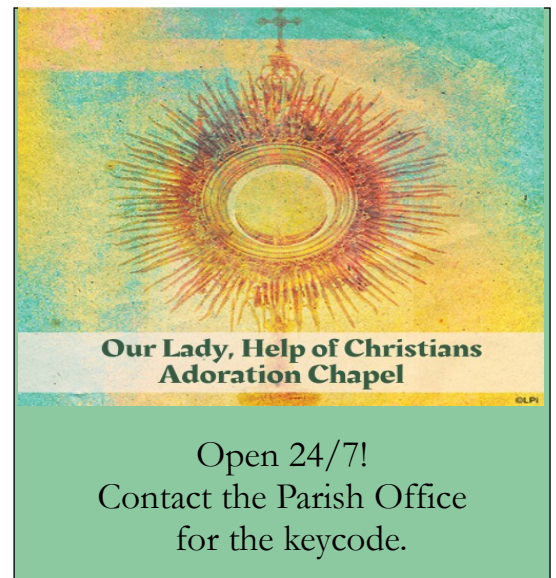
