

Pastor's Column

All Things New Update

As I'm sure everyone knows by now, the Archdiocese of St. Louis is in the middle of a strategic planning process to address the changing demographics and declining vocations within the archdiocese. Here's an update of what is going on:

The Archdiocese has had a policy for over a decade of allowing parishes to remain open as long as they were able to financially survive. However, in a few years, it is apparent that not only will the number of priests fall significantly below the number of parishes, but many parishes, who do not have younger families moving into the neighborhoods will begin to see a drastic decline in membership. In order to make proactive decisions rather than reactive changes, the Archdiocese has partnered with a national organization known as the Catholic Leadership Institute to develop a plan to keep the Catholic Church vibrant while these major changes take place. This means every parish is involved in the process and parish vibrancy, leadership, ministries and facilities are all being evaluated.

You may remember the *Disciple Maker Index Survey* you were asked to fill out – we recently received the results. The data that the Catholic Leadership Institute provided is rather massive, and it takes time to digest. We have a committee of involved parishioners who are helping me process it. But here is a very quick summary: Assumption had a very good participation rate in the survey. Overall, Assumption parishioners are happier in areas of satisfaction with the parish and we tend to score higher in many of the key areas, compared to the diocesan and national averages. Assumption also has very good statistics for Mass attendance, school enrollment, Sunday collection, etc. Our facilities are in very good shape and there are lots of strong ministries and programs here.

One area that all archdiocesan parishes need improvement is helping individual parishioners feel comfortable sharing their experience of faith with others. Of course, this is the key to all our problems today. Families do not share the faith with their children effectively and only a tiny minority have ever asked a young person to consider priesthood or religious life. There are many reasons for this, but clearly this will be the great challenge going forward.

Does all the positive data about Assumption mean *All Things New* will pass by our door but not affect us? Not at all. I am somewhat convinced there are some important decisions to be made on both sides of highway 270 and highway 55. I don't know what kind of decisions are being considered, so I don't know what to predict. Some dioceses have done some creative things to address issues. I also do not know what the school system in South County will look like.

The timeline, as I understand it, will look like this: Right now, the Catholic Leadership Institute and various archdiocesan committees are processing the survey information and other information that is being provided by pastors. In August, an initial set of suggestions will be shared with priests so they will provide input. Then in October, a refined set of plans will be shared throughout the archdiocese at Listening Sessions. Two Listening Sessions will take place in our parish center in October, at that time parishioners input will be welcome. The dates are not settled yet. Then, next Pentecost Sunday, May 28, a final plan will be released. It is presumed that it will take about three years to complete the plan. If I have any incorrect information or if new information becomes available, I will share it with you.

In the meantime, it is important that parishioners around the archdiocese pray for those making decisions and for all those who are directly impacted by the decisions. Invoke the Holy Spirit to lead all of us in this process.




