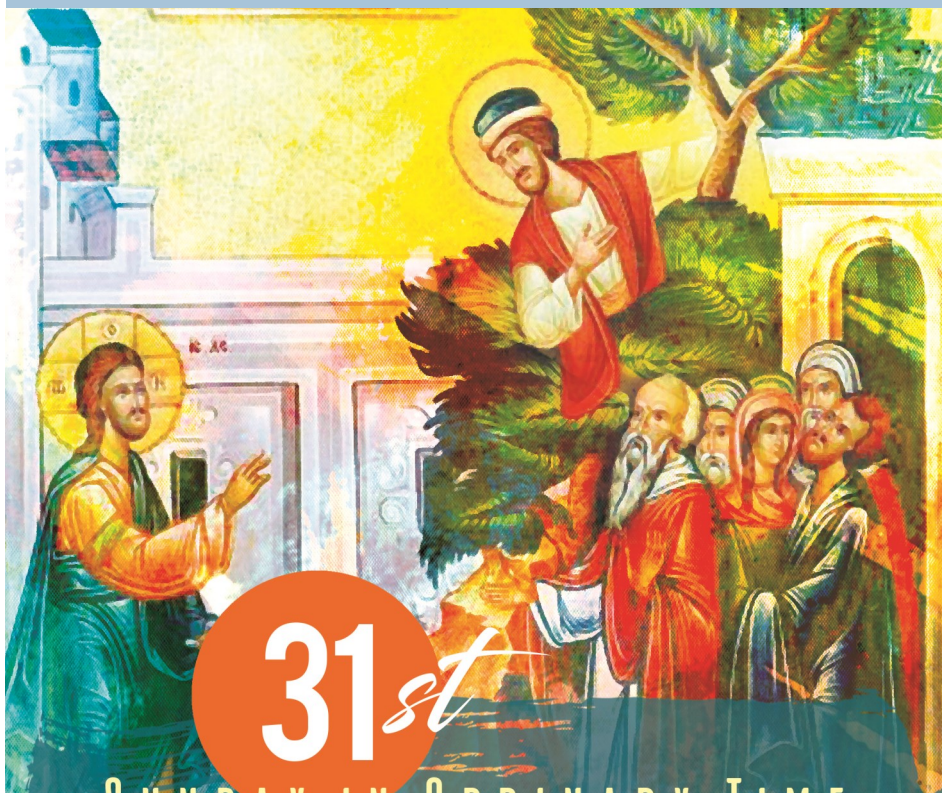

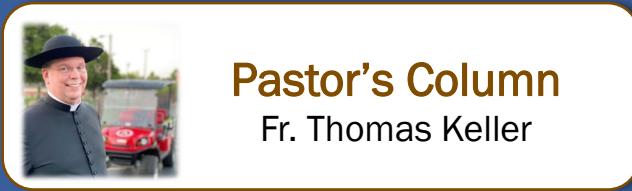

## Pastor's Column

### Remembering Death

We often talk about liturgical seasons like Advent and Lent; each season having its own emphasis and character, but there are two days at the beginning of November that work like a mini-liturgical season.

Beginning on the evening of October 31, All Hallows Eve (Halloween) begins a short reflection on death. While kiddos are out trick-or-treating, the Church begins the great feast of All Saints Day, with First Vespers of All Saints. The priests and religious begin prayers glorifying God for the gift of the saints. Then for the next two days, the Church reflects on the future beyond death.

November 1st is a day of great celebration for the Church, as we remember all those who have entered Eternal Life. All Saints Day remembers all those who lived a truly Christian Life and now, having died, dwell in the eternal peace of heaven. We remember not only those canonized saints who lived lives of heroic virtue, but also those saints who quietly lived in a state of grace and now share in the Beatific Vision of God for all eternity. All Saints Day is a Holy Day of Obligation, and all Catholics should attend Holy Mass on this day to join in the heavenly celebration. Here at Assumption our All Saints Day Mass schedule is: 6:30 a.m., 8 a.m., Noon, 5:30 p.m. and 7 p.m.

Then the next day is All Souls Day. On November 2nd, Catholics pray for all those who have died in a state of grace but still await the joys of heaven. Despite popular misconceptions about death, usually anyone who dies still requires God's mercy to complete the process of spiritual perfection. Any attachments to sin or worldly affections must be purged from the soul before one enters into heaven. This can be done solely through the mercy of God. But we can pray to God asking Him to show His mercy to the poor souls in Purgatory. The most powerful prayer is the Mass. Often we offer Holy Mass for the intention of someone who has passed away. On All Souls Day we will have our regular Masses at 6:30 a.m. and 8 a.m. We will have a special Purgatorial Mass at 7 p.m. to pray specifically for all parishioners who died this last year and to remember anyone who has died.

### Mass Intentions:

Catholics have a beautiful tradition of offering Masses for the intention of other people, either living or dead. Here at Assumption, many people observe this custom. You might notice in the bulletin each week that every Mass has an "intention." You might wonder "how does this work?" The priest holds the intention in his heart when he offers Mass. Anyone is welcome to go to the rectory and request a specific date and Mass. The intention can be for anyone living or dead (often it is for the dead and there is a little cross behind the name to indicate the person is deceased.) There is no cost to have a Mass intention, but a donation of \$10 is recommended by the Archdiocese, however, we will not refuse anyone who wants us to remember them at Mass. We can schedule up to one year in advance. The only reservation is that one Sunday Mass a week must be offered for the parish, it's called a Pro Populo Mass – meaning "for the people."

During this time the baby will receive antibodies from his mother that will provide him with immunity to a wide variety of diseases. The baby is the size of a butternut squash. During this beautiful month of October the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates "Respect Life Month." During this month we take advantage to understand and value the gift of human life and help build a culture that cherishes and protects it. A couple of weeks ago, the Assumption Pro-Life Committee scheduled pro-life speakers after all the Masses. We heard about the good work being done in organizations such as Birthright, Gabriel Retreat Ministries, Pregnancy Help Center, Angel's Arms, Good Shepherd Children and Family Services, and Our Lady's Inn. So much good is being done in our city, and so much work still needs to be done! **"Jesus, Mary, Joseph, we love you very much! Please spare the lives of the unborn babies we have spiritually adopted who are in danger of abortion!"**
