

Pastor's Column

Sometimes we forget the sacred nature of Sunday, known as the Lord's Day. Since the time of the apostles, Christians have regarded Sunday as special. Even though it was a workday to the pagans and Jews, it was special to Christians because it is the day that Jesus rose from the dead.

The apostles and the early Christians gathered in one of their homes on Sundays before dawn and they celebrated the resurrection of Jesus. The Christians would hear the Old Testament and Psalms read, they told the stories of Jesus, and then they would stand and face the rising sun which represented the light of Christ's Resurrection as the apostle, or his delegate (bishop or priest), would offer the bread and wine. The believers would receive the Body and Blood of Christ, give thanks, and then go about the rest of their day.

Sunday is still the day when Holy Mass is celebrated by the entire Catholic community. Catholics should make the Sunday Mass their priority, meaning, it isn't just one more thing we need to do, but it is the most important thing we do. The entire day should be planned around participation in the Sunday Mass. It is a serious sin to miss Sunday Mass, intentionally or accidentally.

Many prefer to attend the anticipated Mass on Saturday evening. This is permitted by the Church. Usually, the anticipated Mass cannot start before 4 p.m. Saturday afternoon wedding Masses and even Saturday morning funeral Masses do not take the place of the Sunday Mass.

Since the time of the early Church, Christians have extended the nature of Sunday to include not only the celebration of Mass but also the inclusion of God's commandment to rest on the sabbath. Even though the sabbath was a Saturday in the original Jewish understanding, Christians have transferred it to the Sunday to align it with dignity of the Lord's day when He rose from the dead. It is important to even set aside household chores. In our modern world there are some jobs that require employees to work, but we can do our part to avoid shopping, even going out to restaurants early in the day to give others that opportunity to worship God and rest with their families. Even sports early in the day on a Sunday violate the spirit of God's commands. In a society that does not respect God's commandments and does not enforce civil laws to protect the Sunday, then we have to do our part to stand counter to society.

In addition to refraining from work whenever possible, there is an aspect of Sunday where we take time to enjoy the company of others, especially family.

Sundays should feel special. Fasting and penance are never permitted on Sunday. We should dress-up on Sunday to express the importance of the day. We live in a society obsessed with casual dress and comfort. While vanity is not becoming of Christians, dressing-up to express the importance of the Sunday Mass is a virtuous action.

In our modern internet-savvy society Masses are often online for the benefit of those who are Homebound. However, attending a broadcast or online Mass never fulfills one's obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. One does not incur a mortal sin when one travels, if one is restricted by ill health, or due to serious obligations for work.



Women's ACTS Retreat October 5-8






