Pastor's Column

Something is Renewed when it is Loved

In dioceses and parishes around the United States, bishops and pastors are participating in the National Eucharistic Revival. The aim of the revival is to restore understanding and devotion by renewing worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. You can find more information at www.eucharisticrevival.org.

Here at Assumption, we are blessed with many parishioners who are deeply devoted to the Holy Eucharist. We can see their devotion through the sincere manner they receive Holy Communion, by attendance at daily Mass, and by participation in our perpetual worship of Jesus in our Adoration Chapel.

However, one of my concerns since COVID has been declining membership in our Adoration Chapel. We cannot honestly consider our chapel to be "perpetual adoration" anymore since so many hours are unfilled. It is time for us to renew our adoration chapel.

In the words of the immortal Fr. Raymond Buehler "something is renewed when it is loved." Certainly, there are around 325 parishioners who love our Lord enough to spend one hour a week with Him in silent adoration. Many of those hours are already filled with long-time adorers so we are not starting from scratch. But in the next few weeks and months, we are going to revisit the idea of Eucharistic Adoration and how to pray a weekly Holy Hour.

Many Eucharistic Adorers, especially those who come during the late night hours are extremely committed to their hour with Jesus. They can witness to the many graces that flow from that time of prayer. They look forward to their holy hour with joy and anticipation.

A healthy Adoration Chapel has at least two permanent adorers per hour and many substitutes. If we had full coverage and sufficient substitutes, we would need about 325 Adorers.


In addition to individuals who are willing to pledge one hour of prayer a week before the Blessed Sacrament in our adoration chapel, I would like to restore our Adoration Committee. This group of people will divide up the week to monitor any empty time slots and help keep our substitute list current. I would like to have two co-chairs who recruit and maintain seven captains each. Each captain would be responsible for about twelve adorers a week. They would make sure all their hours are filled and a substitute list is distributed. It's all an achievable task if we break down the work. I am sure that we will find the volunteers to restore our perpetual adoration of our Lord because "something is renewed when it is loved" and Jesus is deeply loved here at Assumption.

Our parish renewal will officially begin with a Candlelight Eucharistic Procession on Sunday, October 15 immediately after our 6 p.m. Mass. The procession should start around 7 p.m. We will provide candles for participants to carry during the procession. Participants are welcome to place lawn chairs and blankets on the field for a period of "adoration under the stars." Confessions will be available. We should conclude by 8:30 p.m.

In the weeks and months after the Candlelight Procession, Assumption will have other Eucharistic Renewal events to help us deepen our love of Jesus present to us in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Please note: If you need financial assistance with part or all of your retreat fees there are scholarships available. Confidentiality assured.






