Fish Fry

A HUGE thank you to all our fish fry volunteers. It takes every volunteer to make our fish fry successful. This year we sold 12,588 meals! We also sent meals every week to the Ss. Peter and Paul homeless shelter. The #1 comment people made to me was how friendly they found our volunteers. A close second was the quality of the food, and everyone appreciated how quickly the lines moved. Thanks to our Core Team, fryers, cooks, servers, runners, setter-uppers, cleaners and checkers! You truly earned the title of America's Fish Fry!

Facility News

The school and parish center's new building access control and electronic key system are nearing completion. The fire alarm system replacement is also well underway. The new systems will significantly increase the safety and security of our school building. Meanwhile, we are working to find the best new public address system to replace our old intercoms. All these extraordinary projects are funded by the Gala Auction Fund-a-Need, generous donors, and a school safety grant from the state of Missouri.

Unfortunately, a recent audit of the HVAC systems in the church, school, and parish center indicate they are all coming the end of their expected lifespans. The Salesian House already lost its boiler, and we are in the process of replacing it. We will be developing plans to begin replacing units with more energy efficient systems instead of paying for endless maintenance.

Queen of Hearts Raffle

The Queen of Hearts Raffle continues! This progressive raffle has a jackpot that is split 50/50 between the winner and Assumption. Drawings are every Friday when a weekly winner is electronically selected, and a card is electronically uncovered to determine the prize. If the card is the Queen of Hearts, the winner gets 50% of the jackpot. If not, they win a smaller prize, and the jackpot continues to grow. At that time, all the previous tickets are discarded and anyone who plays again has a chance to win the next week. After a lucky weekly winner finds the Queen of Hearts, the raffle resets with a new jackpot and the process repeats.

Raffle tickets cost only \$5 per week; and if parishioners promote it among their family, friends and coworkers, our Queen of Hearts raffle could be a reliable source of income for the foreseeable future. Funds raised by Queen of Hearts are earmarked specifically for capital and maintenance needs; so, the looming HVAC expenses may not be as overwhelming as it may seem. 

Statement of the Missouri Catholic Conference on the Abortion Initiative Petition

The Catholic Church supports and defends society's most vulnerable, especially women and children, through accompaniment, social services, and material assistance.

A misleading proposed amendment to the Missouri Constitution suggests that a "right to an abortion" is needed to protect women, while the amendment could actually put women at risk and endanger preborn children. This ballot initiative would legalize abortions in this state and remove long standing health and safety standards for women. In addition, this initiative does nothing to reduce or eliminate the underlying social causes for abortion and does not further a true culture of life in the state.






