

Pastor's Column

As the Church continues the celebration of Christ's resurrection from the dead during the 50 days after Easter, let's consider some of the effects the resurrection has on our Catholic spiritual life. Chief among these is the theological virtue of Hope. Hope is one of the three theological virtues alongside faith and charity. These three virtues are direct gifts from God bestowed in baptism. Hope transforms our perspective on death. Hope confronts the natural fear of death. Hope is the gift God gives to Christians promising that death is not the end, but it is a pathway to eternal life in heaven. Hope does not promise that we will not suffer or even experience the grief and loss that comes from death, but that something infinitely more will come through suffering and death.

The limited days we face are precious and few and suffering can make us bitter, or it can make us better. Hope promises that suffering is not meaningless, but it can be endured patiently to purify us from our past sins. When a disease is terminal, hope helps us to realize that the sufferings we endure transforms our last days into a time of increased grace and personal growth. Suffering can teach us patience, humility, meekness, and compassion for others. Hope promises sinners redemption.

Also, just as Christ suffered on the Cross for the redemption of others, God can use the sufferings of one person to aid in the conversion of another person. Many saints tell us that offering our suffering for a sinner is a powerful means of sanctification for both the person who suffers and the person for whom the suffering is offered. Hope unites us with Christ's redemptive sufferings on the Cross.

Hope also comforts us in our mourning. When we lose a loved one, we can be overwhelmed by grief. The loss feels final, and the mind is unsettled not only by a loved one's absence but through ongoing concern for the deceased. Often we ask, do they still exist? But hope helps us to realize that death is not the complete annihilation of another person but only a change in relationship. The hope of reunification is only possible in Christ who overcomes death and invites us to "His Father's house." Hope promises unity with those who have died.

Hope also affects our decisions regarding the disposition of mortal remains. Traditionally, when someone died, the family welcomed extended family, friends, and neighbors who came to a visitation. Then next day, a public prayer service was held followed by the burial and a meal. However, this practice is quickly changing as expenses increase. People often ask what parts of a funeral are necessary? The answer is: Christian funerals are twofold expressions of hope, it is still important to pray for the deceased (usually Mass) and the respect for the body (always by burial). Even if the body is cremated, Catholics bury the ashes. Prayers express hope in God's mercy and burial is a sign that expresses hope in the resurrection when Christ will raise the bodies of the dead for the final judgement. Hope in the resurrection promises that even our bodies are not lost to death.




National Shrine of the Miraculous Medal






