

## Pastor's Column Fr. Thomas Keller

One of the great "mysteries" of the Church is the moment at Mass when the ordinary bread and wine cease being bread and wine and miraculously become the resurrected body and blood of Jesus Christ. The moment that this happens is called "the consecration"; specifically, when the priest says the words, "this is my body" and "this is the chalice of my blood." At that moment the bread and wine cease being bread and wine and they are changed into the body and blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus Christ. St. Thomas Aquinas called that moment "Transubstantiation."

This happens because Jesus himself asked us to "do this in memory of me." Jesus explains why he gives his Body and Blood to us. He says, "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day."

I think the hardest part for Catholics to understand today is that when we receive Holy Communion, we are not receiving a thing, we are receiving a living person, Jesus Christ. Jesus does more than tell us how to live, He desires to be one with us spiritually, mentally, and physically. He achieves this by giving Himself to us in Holy Communion.

To respectfully talk about Jesus' presence in what was formerly bread and wine, we use phrases like, the Sacred Host, the Most Precious Blood, the Most Blessed Sacrament, the Holy Eucharist, and Holy Communion. It should be noted that the word Host comes from the Latin word "hostia" meaning victim. So, when we use the word Host, we are referring to Christ on the Cross as the sacred victim.

To express our faith in Jesus who is present in the Eucharist, the priest and people perform certain exterior actions. Maybe the most important is kneeling. Kneeling is a sign of being in the presence of something much greater than us. Genuflecting (bending the right knee to the ground) acknowledges Christ's presence. During the reception of Holy Communion those who receive on the tongue ought to simply open their mouth, extend their tongue a little, close their eyes, and let the priest place the Sacred Host. For those who receive on the hands, they should place one hand directly on top of the other and let the priest place the Sacred Host on to top hand. Then with the bottom hand, they should pick up the Host (careful not to let any small Particles fall to the floor) and place the Host in their mouths, then they walk away from the priest.

It is important to remember that even though we speak of the Sacred Host and the Most Precious Blood, they cannot be separated because the Resurrected Jesus cannot be separated. Whenever you receive under one kind, (either the Sacred Host or the Precious Blood,) you receive the entire person of Jesus. Maybe a better way of saying this is, when you receive communion, the Risen Jesus comes to you in His entirety, holding nothing of Himself back from you. So even if one does not receive directly from the chalice, nothing is missing. This is called Concomitance. It is important that Catholics understand this otherwise, one begins to think of the Eucharist as a thing instead of a living person.

There is an interior action that happens when we receive Holy Communion. We do not "receive" Jesus, but He receives us. God does not move but just like when our soul (and body in the resurrection on the Last Day) dies; it leaves this earth and goes to God, Holy Communion is a moment when we are mystically united to Jesus and more perfectly taken into His Body. It is like a marriage when the "two become one flesh."


