

Pastor's Column Fr. Thomas Keller

As pastor, I tend to ask parishioners to financially support causes that directly benefit the poor, address immediate needs in our educational budget, or make repairs to our facilities. I think this is good because it addresses real needs here at Assumption and throughout the larger Church. I think it unites the community around achievable causes. It gives the parish confidence, it strengthens the bonds of the parishioners by working together, and helps people feel good about themselves.

However, I admit that this is not the best way of encouraging the virtue of generosity. There is a better way. It points to a deeper spiritual truth that some parishioners already understand. It is generosity on a completely different level. It is called "tithing." Tithing is the practice of setting aside a generous portion of your income for God. Already, many of our parishioners practice this type of sacrificial giving even when we are not making specific requests.

Tithing is part of the spiritual life. Tithing is an act of faith. Tithing is about recognizing that all your possessions are gifts from God and cultivating trust in God. Instead of just feeling good about ourselves, we become better Christians through laying our resources at the feet of Jesus.

The practice of tithing is rooted in Scripture. In the Old Testament, Abraham gives a tenth of everything to God (Genesis 14:20). Similarly, in the book of Malachi, God challenges His people to bring the full tithe into the storehouse, promising abundant blessings in return (Malachi 3:10).

Jesus says, "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you" (Luke 6:38). This teaching invites us to trust in God's providence and to give out of love. It doesn't matter if others know if you are giving or not, Jesus says, "don't let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so your almsgiving may be in secret, and your Father who sees you will repay you" (Matthew 6:1-6).

The blessings scripture speaks about are not monetary, so don't expect buckets of money to miraculously appear because you tithe; the blessing is spiritual. Tithing reshapes our priorities and values. By practicing dependence on God, and trusting in His Divine Providence, we become detached from earthly things and more attached to doing God's will. Doing the will of God gives us true and lasting joy.

Many Catholics who tithe donate ten percent of their income, dividing five percent to their parish and the other five percent to other Catholic charitable causes. However, simply increasing your weekly giving a few percent may accomplish the same goal of growing in trust.

Your donations fund the parish mission, which is to worship, provide religious formation, and care for those in need. As so many of our parishioners already know, volunteering time and talent also exponentially expands our capacity to do good. Many parishioners are abundantly generous with their time and talents.

Finally, prayer is essential to tithing. If you pray, God will enflame your heart to give the proper amount of your time, talent, and treasure. The sacrificial giving will unite you more closely to the Heart of Jesus.


