

Choosing a Confirmation Sponsor

Candidates for Confirmation, as for Baptism, fittingly seek the spiritual help of a sponsor. To emphasize the unity of the two sacraments, it is appropriate that this be one of the baptismal godparents. (CCC 1311)

The sponsor must be:

- a practicing Catholic
- at least sixteen years of age
- sufficiently mature, who has received the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation,
- actively practicing the Catholic Faith.



A candidate may choose their baptismal Godparent as a Confirmation sponsor; however, parents or step-parents may not serve as sponsors of their own children. A grandparent or other relative may be a sponsor.

The duty of a sponsor is to serve as a mentor, role model, and guide to the Confirmation candidate throughout the preparation period. Sponsors assist the candidate by working with the candidate in the following areas:

- praying for and with the candidate
- ensuring that the candidate attends Sunday Mass
- attending the Confirmation Retreat on February 8, 2025
- completing at least 1 FIAT with the candidate
- engaging in faith-based conversations with the candidate (who will turn in 2 reports from these interviews)
- attending the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation

Please prayerfully consider who you will invite to serve as your Confirmation sponsor, someone who fulfills the criteria listed above.

Once you have decided who you wish to ask as your sponsor, invite them to take on this role.

Confirmation Sponsor Conversation #1

Now that you have chosen your sponsor, it is time to spend a little more time with him/her to really get to know more about his/her faith journey. After all, the life-long role of your sponsor is to walk with you and support you on your own faith journey. You may find that you already know a lot or that there is a lot that you can learn! You can have your conversation together, at your home or favorite place, or on the phone if your sponsor lives out of town.

Simple rules for sharing:

- Do not glorify sinful behavior or encourage experimentation.
- Give only as much detail as is needed to make your point.
- Be straightforward, honest and encouraging.
- Never gloss over a question the candidate may have.
- Listen carefully and ask follow-up questions.



You will be reading the Gospel of John chapters 14 verses 15-17. As you read through the Scripture, you will be using the SOAP method to journal.





A Letter to the Bishop for Confirmation

You are nearing the end of your preparations to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation! It is good to take time to think and pray about how this Sacrament will help you be more like Jesus and a better witness to Christ in the world. <u>Letters should be typed and printed from the computer</u>. You may include a picture of yourself or you with your sponsor. Correct grammar, spelling and punctuation are expected.

Greeting:

- 1) Include the date at the top
- 2) Address the letter to Archbishop Rozanski using one of the following forms of address: Dear Archbishop Rozanski, OR Your Excellency,

Body of the Letter:

Write at least one sentence for each of the following (a total of about 3 paragraphs).

- 3) State your name and what school/grade you attend, and something interesting about you like a hobby, sport, or your family
- 4) State one thing you like about the Catholic faith and why your relationship with God is important to you.
- 5) Tell one thing about what you learned or how you benefitted through your year of preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation.
- 6) Explain who you chose for your Confirmation patron saint and why you chose that person. You may also mention your sponsor and how your sponsor is helping you.
- 7) Answer the question: How will Confirmation help you be more like Jesus and a better witness to Christ? (This may be answered in several sentences)
- 8) Request to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation and explain why you would like to receive it.
- 9) Ask the Archbishop to pray for you.
- 10) Promise to pray for the Archbishop; thank him for coming to Assumption for Confirmation.
- 11) Close the letter with: Sincerely, or Thank you, or Yours in Christ, or similar
- 12) Print your letter and then sign your name.

Your completed letters will be mailed to the Archbishop's office when all are turned in. The archbishop may ask you about these letters when you meet with him before Confirmation.

You should submit a rough draft to Ms. Stringer for revisions and comments by March 15 and turn in the final copy on March 31 with your completed packet.

Dear Archbishop Rozanski,




My sponsor is my uncle, and he goes to church at St. Jude's. He has helped me be a better Catholic.
