#### **ENCOUNTER THE RISEN CHRIST**

We prayed, fasted and gave alms—and now we celebrate Easter joy! Our Lenten journey with CRS Rice Bowl ends as we encounter our risen Lord. We reflect on our brothers and sisters whom we have walked with in India, Zambia, El Salvador, Mexico, Ethiopia and Hawaii. And we commit to bring Easter joy to each person we meet in our daily lives. Don't forget to turn in your CRS Rice Bowl at church.

#### What Is Resurrection? An Easter Reflection

The resurrection is an invitation to look around to see transformation, to see what is evil being changed, what is immature becoming adult; what appears inert like an egg or seed sprouting life.

But for the Christian the resurrection has a still richer meaning. St. Paul, clearly repeating a catechetical formula that he had learned, says to the Corinthians: "I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day according to the scriptures" (1Corinthians 15:3-4).

Christ is risen, and has promised to take us with him. This life is not the end; we too will be transformed in endless life and beauty. Human life is good, but it will end. The resurrection gives hope and meaning to our existence here. In our weakness we will after death be raised in glory. Again there is continuity: it is I (not just my body) that I hope will be raised. As Paul writes: "So it is with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable, what is raised is imperishable. It is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness, it is raised in power. It is sown a physical body, it is raised a spiritual body" (1Corinthians 15:42-44). Fr. Marcin

My Dear Parishioners,

CHRIST IS RISEN! Truly He is risen! These were the words which were first spoken by the women disciples who went to the tomb of Jesus early on the first day of the week. Angels had announced this news to them. However, it was to Saint Mary Magdalene that the Risen Christ had first appeared and who told her to announce this news to His Apostles. These myrrh-bearing women

brought the good news of Resurrection to Saint Peter and his confreres. The Apostles would bravely proclaim that CHRIST IS RISEN after the descent of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.

For the followers of the Risen Christ each Sunday is "Easter all over again." The first day of the week has become the Sabbath observance for us. Sunday is the day for worship and praise. This is the day for Sabbath rest and meditation. Every Sunday for us is a HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION. Whenever we deliberately miss Holy Mass on the Lord's Day WE ARE IN SIN. This sin must be forgiven in the sacrament of penance before we can present ourselves for Holy Communion. The breaking of the Third Commandment is a serious offense, as is the non observance of the other nine. Right from the start the followers of the Risen Christ gathered to celebrate the Eucharist as is evident in Acts of the Apostles. I emphasize this because our liturgies this Sunday will be better attended because of the feast. I am so happy to see so many whom I do not normally see on a Sunday. I welcome you with joy! But as your Father, I remind you of your weekly obligation to join with us to celebrate EASTER on the first day of the week. Worshipping God each week by celebrating the Eucharist is also a sign of our affirmation of LIFE. Each Sunday celebrates LIFE as we commemorate the Lord Jesus' Holy Resurrection from the dead. For it was on this day that the promise of ETERNAL LIFE became a reality for you and for all those who believe.

Next Sunday we observe DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY, a universal feast which draws our attention to the wonderful gift of mercy our Lord offers to all who come to Him. Through the mystical revelations given to Saint Faustina Kowalska the Lord Jesus exposed His heart overflowing with love and mercy for every sinner. I invite you to join with me for "AN HOUR OF MERCY" which will take place next Sunday beginning at 2 o'clock in the afternoon at Sacred Heart of Jesus Church on East Main Street. During that time a priest will be available for the sacrament of penance. The Divine Mercy Chaplet will be sung at 3 o'clock, the Hour of Mercy.

Sts. Epipodius and Alexander April 22—(St. Epipodius) Patron of the Unmarried

Sts. Epipodius and Alexander were two Christian young men of Lyons-both unmarried and of good position. During the fierce persecution of Marcus Aurelius in that city (178), they were arrested, imprisoned, and finally brought before the governor. Their ready acknowledgment of being Christians elicited the astonishment of the governor who was well aware of the fierce tortures and executions which had already been meted out to Christians.

However, the governor was not deterred in carrying out his task. He separated them and attempted to cajole Epipodius (the younger of the two) to abandon his Faith. But the loyal youth remained unmoved and continued to profess his Faith. Then he was stretched out on a rack and his sides were rent by iron claws. He was finally beheaded.

Two days later, it was St. Alexander's turn. Instead of being frightened by the reminder of his companion's fate, he thanked God for his example and expressed a firm desire to join him. He was scourged umercifully but stood fast in the Faith. Finally, he was sentenced to be crucified, and the moment his battered body was fastened to the cross he passed on to his heavenly reward.

PRAYER: May the prayer of Sts. Epipodius and Alexander make us pleasing to You, Lord, and strengthen us in profession Your truth. Amen.
