



He worked with Betty Friedan and others for the legalization of abortion in the United States. He was also for a time the director of the Center for Reproductive and Sexual Health New York's largest abortion clinic. Nathanson has written that he was responsible for more than 75,000 abortions throughout his pro-choice career.

My Dear Parishioners,

We assemble on the Lord's Day commemorating the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today's Gospel periscope from John is a reminder to us that in Year B of the Lectionary, which is focused on the Gospel of Mark, Johannine segments are inserted due to Mark's Gospel being so short. We will be even more aware of this later in the year when for five weeks we will hear the "Bread of Life Discourse", that is chapter 5 of John's Gospel.

For today we told of the introduction of Saint Peter to the Lord Jesus by his brother, Saint Andrew. Saint Andrew is given the Greek title, "Protoclete", which means "the First Called." His feast day is November 30th. As Saint Andrew introduced his brother Peter to the Lord, so too does Andrew introduce us to Advent and the new liturgical year. Saint Andrew is the patron of Constantinople which serves as the see for the Ecumenical Patriarch of the Orthodox Churches. As Peter and Andrew were brothers so too are the Catholic and Orthodox Churches. The Orthodox Church, although not in full communion, is the closest Church to the Catholic Church. We share Apostolic Succession (valid holy orders), the same sacramental system, veneration of the Mother of God and Ever Virgin Mary, some common liturgical celebrations and more. All of the Roman Pontiffs of the past century have work diligently to heal the division between East and West. As the annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity approaches we ask the Lord to restore the union East and West shared for the first 1,000 years of the Church's history.

Next Monday, January 22nd, I will be leaving on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land which will be led by our Bishop, His Excellency, the Most Reverend Arthur Serratelli. The group will include both clergy and lay people. I will be going with Father Marcin, our former assistant, who I am looking forward to spending this time with.

This coming Saturday, January 20th, our annual ROCKAWAY MARCH FOR LIFE will take place. We begin with the 8 a.m. Mass followed by coffee and bagels in Hayes Hall and then it is off to our walk around Park Lake reciting the Rosary for the protection of human life from conception to natural death. The Catholic Church's PRO LIFE stand is another common belief we share with our Orthodox brothers and sisters. I hope you will join with me and participate in this witness for life! Our outdoor crèche and lights will remain until the leave-taking of Christmas on February 2rd, the 40th day and the Feast of the Presentation of Our Lord in the Temple.

ST. SEBASTIAN, Martyr The Same Day, January 20—Patron of Athletes

St. Sebastian was born at Narbonne in Gaul, educated at Milan, and martyred at Rome about the year 284.

According to an account of the 5th century and now considered unhistorical, he entered the army at Rome under the Emperor Carinus, about the year 283, in order to render assistance to the martyrs. When Diocletian left for the East, St. Sebastian continued to enjoy the esteem of Maximian, his coadjutor in the Empire.

St. Sebastian had prudently concealed his religion, but he was at last detected and accused before Diocletian, who condemned him to be shot to death by arrow. The sentence was executed to the extent that he was left for dead.

Restored to health by the care of a pious widow, he boldly appeared before the Emperor and reproached him for his injustice against the Christians. The Emperor, recovering from his surprise at beholding St. Sebastian alive, commanded that he be beaten to death with clubs. His body was thrown into a sewer; but a pious lady had it privately removed, and buried it in the catacombs.

PRAYER Lord, grant us a spirit of strength. Taught by the glorious example of Your Martyr St. Sebastian, may we learn how to obey You rather than men. Amen
