CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY

All Catholic Churches in the United States require from Catholics serving as a Godparent for Baptism or a sponsor for Confirmation a certificate of eligibility. This document certifies that the Godparent/sponsor is a registered member of the parish, attends Holy Mass, approaches the sacraments regularly and contributes to the support of the Church via the Sunday offering envelope program or "Parish Pay". It is the responsibility of the individual to meet these requirements as listed in the Code of Canon Law, #874.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

A Pre-Baptismal Class is held the third Monday of each month at 7:00 pm in the parish office. No pre-registration required. Both parents are encouraged to attend the class before the birth of the baby. The Sacrament of Baptism is administered weekly at the 12:15 pm Mass and a Baptismal Ceremony at 1:30 pm.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Arrangements are to be made at least ONE YEAR in advance. The date should not be set until the priest has been consulted.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK

Urgent calls will be attended to at any time of the day or night. If there is anyone at home or in the hospital who cannot get to Mass and the Sacraments because of illness or old age, please inform one of the priests or call the Parish Office @ 973-627-0313.

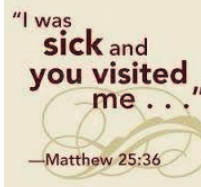

My dear parishioners,

In our celebration of the Lord's Day we commemorate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary AND Joseph. The Holy Family of Nazareth is our focus as we bask in the bright light of Christmas. In the Gospel passage for this Sunday we read of the "Flight into Egypt." The Holy Family flees from their home at the direction of an angel due to the evil Herod wishes to inflict upon the Christ Child. The Holy Family escapes but the baby boys of Bethlehem do not and are slaughtered by Herod's soldiers. Their feast day was yesterday, December 28th.

Saint Joseph is identified as the head of the Holy Family; it is to him that the warning is given and that he is to lead. It is neither Christ nor the Blessed Virgin Mary that receives this heavenly message but rather the Noble Joseph. As husband and father Joseph exemplifies the vocation which in some families is ignored. Joseph is the head of the family as every father should be. Joseph is a man of strength and courage who acts decisively to keep his family from danger. He listens and responds positively to the voice of God.

I have said it before and I say it again, when the father of the household is responsible in both the spiritual and temporal life of the family, that family is safe! This family will survive the assaults of the devil and will grow in holiness. When dad is weak, the family is weak and open for destruction. Today's story of how Saint Joseph responded to danger and to the voice of God gives example to all men.

We pray for our families and especially for the head of the household, DAD! Our Holy Father Pope Francis wrote the following Prayer to the Holy Family for the Feast of Saint Joseph, March 19, 2016:

Jesus, Mary and Joseph, in you we contemplate the splendor of true love; to you we turn with trust. Holy Family of Nazareth, grant that our families too may be places of communion and prayer, authentic schools of the Gospel and small domestic churches. Holy Family of Nazareth, may families never again experience violence, rejection and division; may all who have been hurt or scandalized find ready comfort and healing. Holy Family of Nazareth, make us once more mindful of the sacredness and inviolability of the family, and its beauty in God's plan. Jesus, Mary and Joseph, Graciously hear our prayer. AMEN.

**ST. SYLVESTER I, Pope
December 31**

ST. SYLVESTER, born in Rome, was ordained by Pope St. Marcellinus during the peace that preceded the persecutions of Diocletian. He passed through those days of terror, witnessed the abdication of Diocletian and Maximian, and saw the triumph of Constantine in 312.

Two years later he succeeded St. Melchiades as Bishop of Rome. In the same year he sent four legates to represent him at the great Council of the Western Church, held at Arles. He confirmed its decision and imparted them to the Church.

The Council of Nice was assembled during his reign, in 325, but not being able to assist at it in person, on account of his great age, he sent his legates, who headed the list of subscribers to its decrees, preceding the Patriarchs of Alexandria and Antioch. St. Sylvester occupied the chair of St. Peter for twenty-four years and eleven months. He died in 335.
