ST. JOSEPH NOVENA – The novena to Saint Joseph begins on Tuesday, March 10th at the conclusion of the 8 o'clock morning Mass and will take place each day until the Solemnity of Saint Joseph on Thursday, March 19th. On the feast day following the Holy Mass Saint Joseph pastries will be blessed followed by a brief program on Saint Joseph in Hayes Hall.

Church Regulations Regarding Fast and Abstinence:

Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen years old and older on Ash Wednesday

and on all the Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.

Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal on a given fast day. Catholics who are eighteen years of age but not yest fifty ping are obliged to fast an Ash Wednesday and

yet fifty-nine are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On fast days, two additional smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength. However, the two smaller meals together may not equal one full meal. Moreover, eating solid foods between meals on fast days is not permitted.

BEREAVEMENT SESSIONS TO BEGIN—The passing of a loved one is the greatest hurt which we endure in life. If you recently lost a loved one to death we invite you to participate in our bereavement program here at Saint Cecilia's, open to both parishioners and non parishioners. The six week program begins on March 25 and will meet for the next five Wednesdays from 7 to 8:30 pm in the parish office. The last sessions with be a Mass & candle ceremony in church. Registration is required by calling the parish office at 973.627.0313 prior to March 18th.

My dear parishioners,

We gather on the Lord's Day and commemorate the First Sunday of Lent. The Gospel reading tells us of the temptation the Lord Jesus experienced in the desert. Following the baptism in the Jordan the Lord Jesus went into the desert for 40 days. This was a time for fasting and prayer which would inaugurate His three year ministry. Prayer and fasting fortified Jesus for His confrontation with Satan who had tried to deter the Lord from His mission.

Satan stood before Jesus to tempt Him and he does the same in regard to us. The devil is ever active in our world and does not hesitate to stand before us trying to entice us to abandon our faith. The evil one wants us to remove God from our life and embrace the secular culture which is the reality of today's world. Jesus shows us how to resist and to keep ourselves focused on the Kingdom of Heaven.

This Lent Satan will appear before you in ways in which you will not recognize him. He will come not with horns and a tail but in subtle and surprising ways. He will try to deter you from the Lenten practices which you should be embracing. He will aid you in rationalizing why you cannot incorporate the vigor's of Lent into your daily routine. He will try and convince you that prayer, fasting and almsgiving does not work in your family. Oh, is Satan shroud and masterful! He may even show himself in the comments you may hear from family and friends, so be ready!

The word LENT is derived from an old English word for "spring time." How appropriate that we use this term for the time before Easter when we focus upon the Passion and Death of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. During this time we experience a spring time for the soul as we go deeper into our spiritual life. Every day during Lent we must remember that "IT'S LENT!" From the moment we get out of bed in the morning and to the moment when we return to our bed in the evening, LENT must be on our mind. This will then set the course for the day and guide us in living a more Christ-centered life. In reflecting upon the cruel suffering the Lord Jesus endured for our sins, the Innocent One suffering for the guilty, should we not "inconvenience" ourselves during these 40 days by PRAYER, FASTING, and ALMSGIVING?

Join with me this Lent in making this season a life changing experience, a springtime for the soul, as we come together for daily Mass, Friday Stations of the Cross, reading the Sacred Scriptures, praying the Rosary, and so many other wonderful opportunities to get close to Jesus, the Savior of our souls!


Let's observe Lent better this year than we have in the past! Father Zig

THE father of St. Cunegundes was Sigfrid, first Count of Luxemburg. After a pious education, she was married to St. Henry, Duke of Bavaria, who, upon the death of Emperor Otho III, was chosen King of the Romans. St. Cunegundes was crowned Paderborn in 1002.

In 1014 she went with her husband to Rome and became Empress, receiving together with him the imperial crown from the hands of Pope Benedict VIII. Through married, she lived in continence, for, with her husband's consent, she had made a vow of virginity before her marriage. Calumniators accused her of scandalous conduct, but her innocence was signally vindicated by Divine Providence, as she walked over pieces of flaming iron without injury, to the great joy of the Emperor. Her husband, Henry II, died in 1024, leaving his widow comparatively poor, for she had given away nearly all her wealth in charitable works.

In 1025, on the anniversary of his death, and on the occasion of the dedication of a monastery which she had build for Benedictine nuns at Kaffungen, she clothed herself with a poor habit, adopted the veil, which she received from the hands of the Bishop, and entered that same monastery. Her occupations consisted in prayer, reading, and manual labor, and thus she spent the last fifteen years of her life. She died in 1040, and her body was carried to Bamberg, where it was laid near that of her husband, St. Henry.
