My dear parishioners,

Today is the Second Sunday of Advent As we gather to celebrate the Lord's Day the Gospel reading is taken from the Beginning of the Gospel of Mark in which we are introduced to the Prophet, Forerunner and Baptist, John. The Gospel of Mark is the oldest Gospel and the shortest. This Gospel will be our focus for the Sundays of this new Liturgical Year of 2021. I plan to tell you a little more regarding the Gospel of Mark and the Cycle B Lectionary at another time.

Today Saint John the Baptist is our temporary focus in the Gospel because he will soon exit so that the Lord Jesus may enter. John is the "voice crying out in the desert, 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths.'" The prophet John was the one sent to make the announcement of the Lord's coming, he did the "prep work" so that those who believed would welcome Jesus, "Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken."

In the epistle reading from the Second Letter of Saint Peter we are reminded once again about waiting for the Lord. The delay of the coming of the Day of the Lord should not make us forgetful or unprepared but we must remain vigilant – He is coming! As we wait for that day we are also waiting with expectation for this year's celebration of Christmas, the Feast of Our Lord's Nativity. I think this year's Christmas will indeed play a very special role in our lives as we still struggle with the pandemic. The festivity of Christmas is the special vaccine the Lord is providing for us so that we will not grow despondent as a result of Covid 19 but rather hopeful and cheerful knowing that God is with us!

The coming of God's Only Begotten Son was made possible because of the faith of the all glorious and Ever Virgin Mary. Her YES to God brought salvation into the world. This week we will observe 3 Marian feasts: Monday is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary which is the national feast day for the United States of America. Our Holy Father Pope Francis instituted a new feast to the calendar last year, the Feast of Our Lady of Loreto, which will be observed on Wednesday. This feast celebrates the home of the Holy Family at Nazareth. On Saturday we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the appearance of the Mother of God to the Mexican layman, Saint Juan Diego. This is the WEEK OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY and there is a lot to celebrate! I hope you can join us for Mass on these days to hear more about the feasts and their significance for our lives.

Today is December 6th and the Feast of Saint Nicholas, Archbishop of Myra. Bishop Nicholas was one of the fathers gathered at the Council of Nicea who developed the Creed which contains our faith.



ST. NICHOLAS, Bishop December 6—Patron of Bakers and Pawnbrokers

It is the common opinion that St. Nicholas was a native of Patara in Lycia, Asia Minor. He became a monk in the monastery of Holy Zion near Myra. Of this house he was made Abbot by the Archbishop, its founder. When the See of Myra, the capital of Lycia, fell vacant, St. Nicholas was appointed its Archbishop. It is said that he suffered for the Faith under Diocletian, and that he was present at the Council of Nice as an opponent of Arianism. His death occurred at Myra, in the year 342.

The characteristic virtue of St. Nicholas appears to have been his charity for the poor. It is also related that he was mortified and abstemious from his very infancy. St. Nicholas is regarded as the special patron of children, and our well-known Santa Claus is a derivative of St. Nicholas. The Emperor Justinian built a church in his honor at Constantinople in the suburb of Blacharnae, about the year 340.



He has always been honored with great veneration in the Latin and Greek Churches. The Russian Church seems to honor him more than any other Saint after the Apostles.

PRAYER We call upon Your mercy, O Lord. Through the intercession of St. Nicholas, keep us safe amid all dangers so that we may go forward without hindrance on the road of salvation. Amen.
