My dear parishioners,

We gather to celebrate the Lord's Day on the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the Gospel reading for today we find the Lord Jesus opening the ears and the mouth of a man who suffered from a disability which prevented him from hearing and speaking. The healing of these senses allowed him to hear the Lord's voice and to respond to Him with praise and thanksgiving. In the Old Testament lection for today we read from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah who foretells of the day when healing will become a reality so that blindness will be replaced by sight, deafness by hearing, silence by speech and dancing to replace being crippled. The Lord will allow all this to take place so that the forces of evil may be dismantled and that the glory of God may shine forth.

I am very excited that we begin ALPHA this week at Saint Cecilia's. YOU are invited to join us every Thursday evening for the next 11 weeks as we gather for food, fellowship and discussion in Hayes Hall from 7 to 8:30. You're invited to bring a friend with you, should you like to do so. After having some refreshments and socializing we will begin with showing a short DVD presentation which will serve as the point of discussion for the evening, although not restricted to it. Our sharing and conversations will no doubt prove beneficial and serve as the lure to attend the following week. I know that you will find ALPHA as a door which can open up to a new experience which will prove life-giving in the spirit.

There may be some of you who are apprehensive to attend ALPHA and it is to you that I quote the beginning of today's first lection: "Thus says the Lord: Say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, Fear not!" To you I quote the invitation of the Apostle Philip to the Apostle Nathaniel, "Come and see!" (John 1:46) The ALPHA experience has a stellar record in changing people's lives by changing their hearts. ALPHA's track record has brought countless numbers of people from around the world to exclaim with joy the words of today's Responsorial Psalm, PRAISE THE LORD, MY SOUL! Allow your ears to be open and your tongue loose so that in hearing you may be able to speak and join in company with those who "...show no partiality as you adhere to the faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ." (Today's epistle reading) With Labor Day comes the return of many of our activities which were on hold for the summer. I look forward to the resumption of our parish activities and I pray that you do too!

ST. PETER CLAVER, Priest September 9—Patron of the Black Missions

St. Peter Claver was born at Verdu, Catalonia, Spain, in 1580, of impoverished parents descended from ancient and distinguished families. He studied at the Jesuit College of Barcelona, entered the Jesuit novitiate at Tarragona in 1602 and took his final vows on August 8, 1604. While studying philosophy at Majorca, the young religious was influenced by St. Alphonsus Rodriguez to go to the Indies and save "Millions of those perishing souls."

In 1610, he landed at Cartagena (modern Colombia), the principal slave market of the New World, where a thousand slaves were brought every month. After his ordination in 1616, he dedicated himself to the service of the Black slaves — a work that was to last for thirty-three years. He labored unceasingly for the salvation of the slaves and the abolition of the slave trade, and the love he lavished on them was something that transcended the natural order.

Boarding the slave ships as they entered the harbor, he would hurry to the revolting inferno of the hold, and offer whatever poor refreshments he could afford; he would care for the sick and dying, and instruct the slaves through Black catechists, before administering the sacraments. Through his efforts three hundred thousand souls entered the Church. Furthermore, he did not lose sight of his converts when they left the ships, but followed them to the plantations to which they were sent, encouraged them to live as Christians, and prevailed on their masters to treat them humanely. He died in 1654 and was canonized in 1888 by Pope Leo XIII.

PRAYER God, You conferred on St. Peter Claver a remarkable love and patience to help Your enslaved people and bring them to a knowledge of Your Name. Through his intercession, help us to seek equality for all races. Amen.
