

My dear parishioners,

Today we commemorate the 31<sup>st</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time as we celebrate the Lord's Day. The Sacred Scriptures which are presented for our reflection this Sunday speak of the Commandments of God and of the High Priest, Jesus, who saves those who offer themselves in holiness of life. In the first lection from the Book of Deuteronomy Moses instructs the people to observe the Commandments by loving God so that they may experience the goodness of the Lord. In the Gospel lection we hear the Lord Jesus affirm the Commandments of God by summarizing them in two: love of God and love of neighbor. Jesus says that everyone who keeps these two "...are not far from the Kingdom of God." When these Commandments are observed we can offer our lives in sacrifice to God in the example of Jesus the High Priest.

Loving God and loving our neighbor go hand in hand. The Apostle John writes: "And this commandment we have from Him, that he who loves God should love his brother also." (1John 4:21) Our love for the Lord is demonstrated in such a marvelous fashion when we come to the assistance of those in need. Love shows itself in deeds of mercy and compassion. Faith in God reveals itself in the good works we perform in Jesus' Name. The Apostle James reminds us: "If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and in lack of daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace, be warmed and filled,' without giving them the things needed for the body, what does it profit? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead." (James 2:16-17)

Today is a special and wonderful day within the Diocese of Paterson for we have yet another opportunity to put our faith into action by our participation in the annual **DIOCESAN MINISTRIES APPEAL** (formally known as the Bishop's Annual Appeal). Our participation in this appeal comes to the aid of so many of our brothers and sisters who are in need. The primary beneficiary of the appeal is Catholic Charities which funds our food pantries, shelters, homes for the disabled, programs for the addicted and so much more. ### ST. MARTIN DE PORRES, Religious November 3 - Patron of Hairdressers

St. Martin de Porres was born at Lima, Peru, in 1579. His father was a Spanish gentleman and his mother an Indian woman from Panama. At fifteen, he became a lay brother at the Dominican Friary at Lima and spent his whole life there—as a barber, farm-laborer, almoner, and infirmarian among other things.

Martin had a great desire to go off to some foreign mission and thus earn the palm of martyrdom. However, since this was not possible, he made a martyr out of his body, devoting himself to ceaseless and severe penances. In turn, God endowed him with many graces and wondrous gifts, such as aerial flights and bilocation.

St. Martin's love was all-embracing, shown equally to humans and animals, including vermin, and he maintained a cats' and dogs' hospital at his sister's house. He also possessed spiritual wisdom, demonstrated in his solving his sister's marriage problems, raising a dowry for his niece inside of three days' time, and resolving theological problems for the learned of his Order and for Bishops. A close friend of St. Rose of Lima, this saintly man died on November 3, 1639 and was canonized on May 6, 1962, by Pope John XXIII.

PRAYER God, You led St. Martin by the way of humility to heavenly glory. Help us to follow the example of his holiness and so become worthy to be exalted with him in heaven. Amen.
