#### My dear parishioners,

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ commonly known as CORPUS CHRISTI (Latin: Body of Christ). Prior to the reforms of the Second Vatican Council this feast was observed on the first "free" Thursday following Pentecost. Thursday was chosen because it was on a Thursday that Our Lord celebrated the Last Supper at which He instituted the Most Holy Eucharist. This feast was introduced to the Western Church through the efforts of a Belgium nun, Saint Juliana, in the Middle Ages. The great theologian, Saint Thomas Aquinas wrote the beautiful prayers and hymns associated with this feast which we still use today. A feature of today's observance is the singing of the SEQUENCE, a musical and poetic work which is sung at the Holy Mass prior to the proclamation of the Gospel.

Since the Institution of the Most Blessed Sacrament occurred at the Last Supper, the observance of Corpus Christi allows us to celebrate the Institution of the Eucharist with great joy rather than during the austerity of Holy Week when our thoughts are on the Lord's Passion and Death. A great demonstration of our joy and faith in the Lord Jesus "hidden in the Blessed Sacrament" is the outdoor procession which is traditional throughout the world. On this day the Holy Eucharist, placed in the monstrance (the vessel for exposition), is carried by the priest in procession throughout the neighborhood of the church (and beyond in some places) accompanied by the faithful. I hope that you will join Father Matt and me this afternoon at 2 o'clock at Sacred Heart of Jesus Church for our combined parish Corpus Christi Procession.

Of course we are in the midst of a EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL called for by the Bishops of the United States. This revival will culminate in a "Eucharistic Congress" which will take place in Indianapolis next July with thousands of Catholics from throughout the country in attendance. A wonderful sign of faith occurred in Manhattan over the Memorial Day weekend when thousands of people from the Archdiocese of New York participated in a Eucharistic procession through Times Square and ending at Saint Patrick Cathedral. Media reports said that the procession occurred without disruption and that onlookers were very respectful.

I plan to hold a large outdoor procession with the Blessed Sacrament starting in our church and walking through the streets of the borough until we reach Sacred Heart of Jesus Church on East Main Street. I will be meeting with Father Matt, Father Pawel (Pastor of Sacred Heart Church) and lay people from both parishes to plan this event which I hope will draw hundreds of people. I hope to have this event next year prior to the close of the July Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. #### ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA, Priest and Doctor of the Church June 13 – Patron of the Poor

St. Anthony, called "St. Anthony of Padua" on account of his long residence in that city, was a native of Lisbon in Portugal, where he was born in 1195, receiving the name of Ferdinand at his Baptism. At an early age his parents placed him in the community of the Canons of the Cathedral of Lisbon, by whom he was educated. At fifteen he entered the Order of Regular Canons of St. Augustine near Lisbon. After two years he was sent to the convent of the Holy Cross of the same Order at Coimbra.

He had lived in this house eight years, intent on his studies, when the relics of five Franciscan martyrs were brought from Morocco to Portugal. This event inspired him to follow in the footsteps of these heroes of the Faith. When this became known his brethren offered extreme opposition, but he finally obtained the consent of the prior and passed over to the Franciscan Order.

After some time he obtained leave to go to Africa to preach to the Moors, but a severe illness obliged him to return to Spain. However, the vessel was driven to Sicily by contrary winds, and the desire to see St. Francis took him to Assisi, where a general chapter of the Order was in progress. At first he was entirely ignored in the Order, and he purposely kept himself in obscurity; but Providence soon revealed to the Franciscans what a treasure they had acquired, and St. Anthony was made professor of theology, which subject he later taught successively at Bologna, Toulouse, Montpellier, and Padua.

He gave up teaching to devote himself to preaching, for he was an accomplished orator, being at the same time filled with zeal for souls. In this work he traveled through France, Spain, and Italy. He was invested with several important dignities in his Order and labored hard to preserve monastic discipline, boldly opposing the famous General Elias, who sought to introduce relaxations. He died June 13, 1231, and was canonized the following year by Pope Gregory IX.

PRAYER Almighty, ever-living God, You gave Your people the extraordinary preacher St. Anthony and made him an intercessor in difficulties. By his aid grant that we may live a truly Christian life and experience Your help in all adversities. Amen.
