

WORK ON OUR PROPERTY – There are a number of projects which are or will be taking place on our parish property. The front porch of the convent has been replaced to provide a safer access for the Sisters. The retaining wall behind the rectory will be replaced and a portion of the retaining wall near the school will also be replaced. #### My dear parishioners,

Today we commemorate the 11<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time as we gather to celebrate the Lord's Day. Looking at the Scripture texts for this Sunday we see the theme of leadership emerging and inviting us to reflect upon it. In the Old Testament reading Moses appears as the leader of the escaped Israelites who camp in the Sinai. The Lord not only confirms Moses' role as leader but also informs the people of their leadership role in the world. For this nation itself will be "a kingdom of priests, a holy nation" which will draw others to the Lord of hosts by their example of faithful service.

In the Gospel passage the Lord Jesus is that good leader, the Good Shepherd, who has love for His sheep and cares for them by providing other shepherds to minister to them. These are the laborers, although not many in number, who lovingly provide pastoral care in His Name. The Gospel names these laborers as the 12 Apostles who go forth and perform the same works as does the Master. They minister without desire for neither worldly recognition nor riches but only for the sake of the Kingdom of God. Their life of service models true leadership which is shown in the unselfish care of others.

In the United States we observe Father's Day which invites us to express our gratitude to our father for the love and leadership he provides for the family. Although fathers are not perfect, just as none of us are, nonetheless they are called upon to give their family the provisions and protection it needs to thrive in our world. A father's strength and wisdom are guiding forces which keep their family secure and healthy. A father's faith helps to establish a firm spiritual foundation for his family. His spiritual leadership in this life will ultimately lead his family to eternal life.

As the Gospel for this Sunday speaks of the Apostles we know that those who followed them are the bishops who stand in Apostolic Succession. Their ministry is shared with the priests, with limitations, so that those in holy orders are leaders in the family which is the Church. Their "fatherly leadership" is indeed important for the Christian community and is the cause for our needed prayers that many more will be called to this office. Today let us remember the "Fathers" of our Church, the Bishops and Priests to whom we look for pastoral leadership. Let us pray for our seminarians that they will continue in their formation to become good priests. Let us pray that many more young men may hear the call of Christ to come and follow Him in service to God's People.

## ST. ALOYSIUS GONZAGA, Religious June 21 - Patron of Catholic Youth

This youthful scion of the illustrious house of Gonzaga, son of Ferdinand, Marquis of Castiglione, was born at Castiglione in the diocese of Brescia, March 9, 1568. From his tenderest years St. Aloysius devoted himself heart and soul to the service of his Creator. His memory has come to us with the sweet fragrance of the most unsullied purity. He united an innocence perfectly angelic with a penance truly heroic.

At fourteen years of age he accompanied his father to Spain, where the latter went to attend the Empress, Maria of Austria, wife of Maximilian II. Phillip II made him page to Prince James, elder, brother of Philip II. His innocence remained uncontaminated amid the vanities of the court, nor could the world draw his heart from God.

On his return to Italy in 1584, he manifested his desire to enter the Society of Jesus. In spite of opposition, he finally succeeded in carrying out his intentions and became a novice at Rome in 1585, during the pontificate of Pope Pius V. He made his profession November 20, 1587, and soon after received minor orders.

From the beginning of his religious life St. Aloysius was a model of perfection. During an epidemic in Rome in 1591, he distinguished himself by his charity toward the sick in the hospital. These labors brought on him the illness that ended in his death. His last days were the faithful echo of his briefly consummated life. He exchanged time for eternity on June 21, 1591, at twenty-four years of age. St. Aloysius was canonized in 1726 by Pope Benedict XIII.

PRAYER God, Author of all heavenly gifts. You gave St. Aloysius both a wonderful innocence of life and a deep spirit of penance. Through his merits grant that we may imitate his penitence. Amen
