INVITATION TO RCIA— Have you been worshiping with us, but have never officially taken the step to become Catholic? My dear parishioners,

We come into God's House today to celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on this 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time. We enter into this holy house to recall the Lord Jesus' victory over death in His Holy Resurrection, the victory which took place "on the first day of the week." (John 20:1) At the Lord's command and in the tradition of the Apostles we celebrate the Eucharist recalling Christ's suffering, death and Resurrection. This is the divine feast to which we are invited to "taste and see the goodness of the Lord." (Psalm 34:8)

This divine banquet is foreshadowed in the Old Testament reading from the Prophet Isaiah who envisioned a feast which is rich and abundant for all the peoples of the earth. All are welcome to indulge in the Lord's generosity and to savor His rich fare.

We hear in the Gospel parable which the Lord Jesus speaks in today's Gospel periscope that the invitation to attend the divine banquet is ignored by some. Excuses galore come forth from those who are concerned with trivial matters. Those who reject the invitation to the feast also become enraged when the Lord's servants are sent to remind them of the invitation. Resentment spews forth from those who find other interests more appealing then the Lord's generosity. It is to these that the Lord's words apply: "The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come...Bind his hands and his feet, and cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth."

The "wedding feast" which God provides cannot be found anywhere else but in His Church. The heavenly food which is provided for us is the Most Holy Eucharist; the precious, holy and life-giving Body and Blood of our Lord, God and Savior Jesus Christ. This is the medicine of immortality, the antidote to death which the faithful receive as pilgrim fare on their journey to heaven.

We continue to experience the EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL called by the Bishops of the United States. This revival is meant to reaffirm our faith in the true presence of the Lord Jesus in the Eucharist. The Holy Communion we receive at every Mass is Christ Himself who is worthy of all worship and praise.

I am so grateful to Father Matt and our school staff who assisted him in conducting a "Eucharist Day" at Divine Mercy Academy last Thursday on the feast of Saint Faustina, the Apostle and Secretary of Divine Mercy. Father brought the Most Blessed Sacrament into the school where a chapel was set up in one of the classrooms so that the students and teachers could come throughout the day to spend some time in prayer before Our Lord. What a wonderful job Father did in reminding our Catholic school children and staff of the reverence we are to show to Jesus, the Bread of Life.

I remind you again of how we present ourselves to receive Holy Communion at Holy Mass, with reverence and devotion. GLORY TO JESUS CHRIST-GLORY FOREVER!

STS. Isaac Jogues, John De Brebeuf, Priests, and Companions, Martyrs—October 19

Sts. Isaac Jogues, John de Brebeuf, Charles Garmier, Anthony Daniel, Gabriel Lallemant, Noel Chabanel, John de Lalande and Rene Goupil, French Jesuits, were among the missionaries who preached the Gospel to Huron and Iroquois Indians in the United States and Canada. They were martyred by the Iroquois Indians in the years 1642, 1648, and 1649. Pope Pius XI beatified them on June 21, 1925, and in 1930 they were canonized by the same Pope.

St. Isaac Jogues, in particular, is outstanding. IN the course of his labors preaching the Gospel to the Mohawks in Canada he penetrated to the eastern entrance of Lake Superior, one thousand miles inland and became the first European to do so. In 1648, he was taken captive by the Iroquois and imprisoned for thirteen Months. During this time, he underwent cruel tortures and ultimately lost the use o his hands. After being rescued by the Dutch, he returned to Canada two years later, and in 1646 he visited Auriesville, New York, to negotiate peace with the Iroquois. He is said to be the first Catholic priest to have set foot on Manhattan Island.

On a third visit to the Iroquois, the Bear clan, which believed that he was a sorcerer, blamed him for an outbreak of sickness and the failure of their crops. Accordingly, he was seized, tortured, and beheaded.

PRAYER God, You consecrated the spread of the Faith in North America by the blood of St. Isaac Jogues and his companions who were preaching the Faith to the Indians. Through their intercession let more people everywhere respond to the Good News of salvation. Amen.
