My dear parishioners,

We come together to celebrate the Eucharist on this 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Scriptural texts for today speak to us about the love we have for the Lord and how this love manifests itself in the manner in which we care for others, especially the marginalized.

Today we conduct what is called THE IN PEW COMMITMENT portion of the annual Diocesan Ministries Appeal. The video presentation we will see today is led by our Bishop who speaks to us about the various needs which the appeal will address. Once again we will hear that the primary beneficiary will be Catholic Charities in the Diocese of Paterson which assists thousands of people each year who are in need of food, clothing, emergency housing, counseling and so much more. The homes which the diocese maintains for disabled adults as well as the upgrading to the Father English Community Center in Paterson are so important in our service to those in need. We must remember that our brothers and sisters who experience very challenging crosses in life look to us to bring them relief. And that we do when we all participate in the annual DIOCE-SAN MINISTRIES APPEAL knowing that our faith in Christ propels us into action.

Today we are all being called upon to be generous and to help with making a contribution. As you have heard, or will hear, our contributions are vital in funding the ministries which make the Apostolic work in the diocese possible. In addition to funding Catholic Charities the appeal also provides a place for our retired priests to live out their remaining years in Nazareth Village. Our future priests are also served through the appeal to cover the cost of seminarian education. Also inner-city Catholic education receives a grant from the appeal to help impoverished children.

I was asked by the diocese to speak to the priests about Saint Cecilia's generous response to the appeal which last year totaled \$100,000 (our parish goal being \$36,000). I reported that the Rockaway people are generous because they have strong faith and take seriously the words of Christ Jesus who said, "Whatever you do to the least of my brothers, you do to me." (Matthew 25:40) When I think of all of you, my dear parishioners, I recall the words of the Apostle Paul to the Thessalonians in today's epistle, "you became a model for all believers."

Let's keep up the generosity of which Saint Cecilia's is known! Let's all participate in the annual DIOCESAN MINISTRIES APPEAL so that "the least among us" will know that we love and care for them!



ST. MARTIN DE PORRES, Religious November 3 - Patron of Hairdressers

St. Martin de Porres was born at Lima, Peru, in 1579. His father was a Spanish gentleman and his mother an Indian woman from Panama. At fifteen, he became a lay brother at the Dominican Friary at Lima and spent his whole life there—as a barber, farm-laborer, almoner, and infirmarian among other things.

Martin had a great desire to go off to some foreign mission and thus earn the palm of martyrdom. However, since this was not possible, he made a martyr out of his body, devoting himself to ceaseless and severe penances. In turn, God endowed him with many graces and wondrous gifts, such as aerial flights and bilocation.

St. Martin's love was all-embracing, shown equally to humans and animals, including vermin, and he maintained a cats' and dogs' hospital at his sister's house. He also possessed spiritual wisdom, demonstrated in his solving his sister's marriage problems, raising a dowry for his niece inside of three days' time, and resolving theological problems for the learned of his Order and for Bishops. A close friend of St. Rose of Lima, this saintly man died on November 3, 1639 and was canonized on May 6, 1962, by Pope John XXIII.



PRAYER God, You led St. Martin by the way of humility to heavenly glory. Help us to follow the example of his holiness and so become worthy to be exalted with him in heaven. Amen.
