INVITATION TO RCIA— Have you been worshiping with us, but have never officially taken the step to become Catholic? My dear parishioners,

In our celebration of the Lord's Day we commemorate the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. Next Sunday will be the final Sunday in the Year of Grace 2023, the Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. The question, "what do you really value" can be answered by believers as is shown in the Scripture texts which are given for our reflection today. The answer is found in the faith which one possesses and is willing to guard it and capitalize on it so as it make it grow in strength. This is the valuable possession which motivates and sustains, and which wisdom guards. The personification of wisdom is found in the wonderful Book of Proverbs in chapter 31 beginning in verse 10 through verse 31. Our first reading for this Sunday provides us with only selected verses from this larger periscope. Wisdom is portrayed as a diligent and prudent wife whose activities and insights are laudable. This is a treasure of a description of wisdom which I hope you will read in its entirety, again Proverbs 31:10-31.

Speaking of treasure, the parable which the Lord Jesus told and which we find as our Gospel reading for this Sunday speaks of treasure, MONEY. Our Lord Jesus spoke about money more often than He did about prayer! Yes, believe me He did and to which any Biblical scholar will testify. Many times that rubs some people the wrong way which indicates the overemphasis of money in their lives and an unwillingness to share it with others.

Investment is an important feature in the parable which Jesus told and an indication to us that we should be mindful of the gifts we have been given and put them to good use for the sake of the Kingdom of God. This is wisdom! Our management of these gifts, or talents, will be questioned by our Lord on the day of accounting. One's willingness to use the treasure we have been given by the Lord is a sign of our understanding that the treasure is not ours to bury but to be wisely used in the service of the Master. We call this responsibility given us STEWARDSHIP. We own nothing; if we did we would be able to take it with us into eternity. Everything we have comes to us from the Creator who gifts each of us according to His plan, some with more and others with little. However, all are accountable regardless of what God has given and for that we will be judged on the last day.

ST. CECILIA, Virgin and Martyr November 22—Patroness of Musicians

According to her legendary Acts, Cecilia was a native of Rome. At an early age she made a vow of virginity, but her parents forced her to marry a nobleman named Valerian. She converted him to the Faith of Christ, and, by the Providence of God, preserved her virginity. She also converted Tiburtius, the brother of Valerian. Both these men suffered martyrdom for the Faith, and St. Cecilia died the same glorious death a few days after. Their death occurred probably in the reign of Marcus Aurelius or of Commodus, between the years 161 and 192.

The name of St. Cecilia has always been most illustrious in the Church, and since the primitive ages it has been mentioned in the Canon of the Mass (First Eucharistic Prayer). She is honored as the patroness of ecclesiastical music.
