HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION – The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is Friday, December 8<sup>th</sup>. This is the patronal feast of the Church in the United States of America. We will celebrate the feast with a Vigil Mass on Thursday afternoon, December 7<sup>th</sup> at 4:30. On Friday, December 8<sup>th</sup> Holy Mass will be celebrated in the morning at 6:30 and 8 o'clock. An evening Mass will be celebrated at 7 o'clock. Please be aware that Church Street will allow for two-way traffic, unlike the weekend arrangement. It is recommended to park in our parish parking lots on Thursday and Friday.

RORATE MASS – The 6:30 a.m. weekly Mass during the season of Advent will be celebrated in honor of the Mother of God and Ever Virgin Mary. This Mass is known as the "Rorate Mass" which is a custom centuries old in the Western Church. Rorate is the Latin word for the term "to drip moisture" which comes from the Old Testament regarding the prediction of the coming of the Messiah.


#### Saint Juan Diego, Layman December 9

Little is known about the life of Juan Diego, to whom Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared on December 9, 1531. His given name was said to be "Cuauhtlatzin" (meaning "Talking Eagle" in his native language).

He was a member of the Chichimeca people, one of the more culturally advanced groups living in the Valley of Anahuac, as the area that is now Mexico City was once known. He was a leader of his own people and may have been involved in the area's textile industry.

After the apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary, according to tradition, Juan Diego received the Bishop's permission to live as a hermit in a small hut near the chapel that was built on Tepeyac. There he cared for the church and the first pilgrims who came to see the miraculous image and pray to the Mother of Jesus. His contemporaries were impressed with his holiness; parents used to bless their children with the wish "May God make you like Juan Diego."

PRAYER Lord God, through Blessed Juan Diego You made known the love of Our Lady of Guadalupe toward Your people. By his intercession, grant that we who follow the counsel of Mary, our Mother, may strive continually to do Your will. Amen.
