My dear parishioners,

We gather on the Second Sunday of Advent to commemorate the Lord's Day with the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The Gospel Passage from the Evangelist Mark introduces us to the person of John the Baptist who is the forerunner of the Messiah, Christ our Savior. The Baptist is portrayed as a man of the wilderness who lives an austere life and emerges to "make ready the way of the Lord" by inviting others to repentance and conversion. John's message is one of urgency and that failure to do as he proclaims will mean spiritual devastation and eternal damnation. The epistle reading for this Sunday taken from the Second Letter of Saint Peter confirms the message proclaimed by the Baptist John which echoes through time. The message of John the Baptist resonates throughout this season of Advent calling all of us to repentance and conversion. What a wonderful time for us to set aside the unimportant "stuff" which clutters our lives and which weighs us down so that we can welcome the Lord in a beautiful way at Christmas. Firstly, let us approach the sacrament of penance this Advent. Going to confession cleanses the soul, ridding us of the sins which bring us into darkness. Encouraging our spouse, children and friends to come to the confessional will be like going to the banks of the Jordan. (Our Advent Penance service will take place on Monday, December 18<sup>th</sup> at 7 o'clock in the evening.) Praying the Rosary DAILY and/or attending DAILY Mass are some additional signs of a committed Christmas preparation.

I hope you will join with me in making this Advent truly one of anticipation of the Nativity Feast so that we may experience it with joy and as a foretaste of our meeting the Lord in the glory of eternity. Your anticipation is so vividly demonstrated in the generosity so many of you show by your participation in the annual ADVENT TREE PROJECT and the BABY BASSINET PROJECT which assist those in need. I am always astonished by your generosity which I know you perform in Jesus' Name and is a sign of your faith in Him.

The humility of Saint John the Baptist is present in the Gospel for today. He bows before the Messiah and serves Him with devotion. As we consider the virtue of humility let us recall the humility of the Messiah-Christ, who humbled Himself in leaving the glory of heaven to be born among us so that we might one day share in the glory of heaven.

#### ST. LUCY, Virgin and Martyr December 13—Patroness of the Blind

ST. LUCY, a native Syracuse in Sicily, was from her cradle educated in the Faith of Christ under the care of her widowed mother, Eutychia. At an early age she secretly made a vow of virginity. She accompanied her long-suffering mother to the tomb of St. Agatha, and there her mother was cured of her disease. St. Lucy then disclosed to her mother the vow she had taken, and her mother, in gratitude for her recovery, left her free to follow her pious inclinations.

The young nobleman who had sought her in marriage was so enraged that he accused Lucy of being a Christian. She was imprisoned, but God gave her grace to overcome the tortures she was made to endure. About the year 304, during the fierce war waged against the Christians under Diocletian, St. Lucy met her death by the sword.

PRAYER Lord, may the intercession of Your Virgin and Martyr St. Lucy help us so that, as we celebrate her heavenly birthday on earth, we may contemplate her triumph in heaven. Amen.
