My dear parishioners,

We gather to celebrate the Lord's Day on the 7th day in the Octave of Christmas and the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The Gospel reading for this day recalls the day on which the young couple, Joseph and Mary, took the Child Jesus to present Him in the temple. On that day they encountered two senior citizens, Simeon and Anna, who raised their voices in praise of God after beholding the Child Jesus. In their advanced years they demonstrated their ability to rejoice in the hope of seeing the Messiah and making known His coming to those whom they met. From these seniors came the credible witness of faith which they did not hesitate to share.

In today's Old Testament reading from Genesis and the epistle reading from the Letter to the Hebrews two other seniors are spoken of, Abraham and Sarah, our grandparents in faith. From this old couple came forth a faith so dynamic that its effects are felt to this very day. Hoping beyond hope, they placed their trust in God who assured them that they would not remain childless but that a miracle would occur giving them the son for whom they longed. This birth would start the beginning of a family which would exist through the centuries and until the end of time. This is the family of faith-filled believers in the God who has saved us in Jesus His Only Begotten Son.

FAMILY and FAITH are the crucial words for this Sunday. It is in the family that faith is fostered and passed down to children so that they may be introduced to the Lord of creation. Parents and grandparents have a critical role in this task of strengthening faith within the family. This task is becoming more difficult to conduct within our secular culture which opposes the influence of religion within society. Young parents and grandparents are called by Christ to be faithful in their duty of maintaining religious life in the home, like Saint Joseph and the Blessed Virgin Mary AND like Simeon and Anna. Parents and grandparents are reminded that children are watching and listening! It is important for us to live authentic Christian lives. Honesty, kindness, generosity, the pursuit of truth should be on our daily agenda so that our young people may imitate us in the ways of God. In this way the Church will grow, vocations to the priesthood and religious life will flourish and our country will remain true to the ideals which brought this nation into being.

The holy family must be your family, **AND YOU**, mom and dad & grandma and grandpa, must take up your important role in making this a reality for your family. Pray that Jesus, Mary and Joseph will help you in your task!

STS. BASIL THE GREAT AND GREGORY NAZIANZEN, Bishops and Doctors of the Church

In the revision of the calendar the Church has seen fit to honor these two great Doctors of the Church and fast friends on the same day.

St. Basil the Great was born at Caesarea of Capadocia in 330. Both of his parents and several of his brothers and sisters are honored among the Saints. He attended school in Caesarea, as well as Constantinople and Athens, where he became acquainted with St. Gregory Nazianzen in 352. A little later, he opened a school of oratory in Caesarea and practiced law. Eventually he decided to become a monk and founded a monastery in Pontus which he directed for five years. He wrote a famous monastic rule which has proved the most lasting of those in the East. After founding several other monasteries, he was ordained and, in 370, made Bishop of Caesarea. In this post (until his death in 379) he continued to be a man of vast learning and constant activity, genuine eloquence and immense charity. This earned for him the title of "Great" during his life and Doctor of the Church after his death.

St. Gregory was born at Arianzen in Capadocia of parents who are both honored among the saints. He studied at Caesarea, Alexandria, and Athens, in which latter city he had as fellow pupils St. Basil and Julian the Apostate. On his return to Nazianzen he was baptized by his father and began to lead a most holy life. In 358, he joined St. Basil in the solitude of Pontus and remained until his father (who was Bishop of Nazianzen) recalled him shortly after and ordained him a priest, much against his wishes. He was appointed Bishop of Sasima, a small town, in 372 by St. Basil.

St. Gregory preferred a life of quiet solitude and reflection, but circumstances always conspired to call him away from it. In 379, he was made Bishop of Constantinople and remained there until 381 when he was finally able to resign and return to his solitude up to his death in 389. The depth of his theological knowledge and the vastness of his eloquence have made him one of the greatest Doctors of the Greek Church.

PRAYER Lord God, You desired to enlighten Your Church by the life and teachings of Sts. Basil and Gregory. Grant that we may learn Your truth with humility and faithfully put it into practice with love. Amen.
