CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY

All Catholic Churches in the United States require from Catholics serving as a Godparent for Baptism or a sponsor for Confirmation a certificate of eligibility. This document certifies that the Godparent/sponsor is a registered member of the parish, attends Holy Mass, approaches the sacraments regularly and contributes to the support of the Church via the Sunday offering envelope program or "WeShare". It is the responsibility of the individual to meet these requirements as listed in the Code of Canon Law, #874.

My dear parishioners,

In our celebration of the Eucharist on the Lord's Day we return to the use of the color green indicating that we are back into Ordinary Time after last Sunday's Feast of the Epiphany in conjunction with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

The Scripture texts for this Second Sunday in Ordinary Time highlight the importance of an introduction to the spiritual life which the Lord is inviting us to enter with confidence and commitment. The wonderful story of the call of Samuel, by the Lord, as the young boy sleeps near the ark of God is indeed an example of how the boy is introduced to the Lord by Eli. The old man instructs the boy in responding to the voice of the Lord so that he may be ready to answer when called upon. The boy Samuel presents himself attuned to the Lord and ready to serve in the capacity which the Most High will accompany him for "the Lord was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect."

There are two introductions in the Gospel periscope; John the Baptist introducing his disciples to Jesus, "the Lamb of God," and the Apostle Andrew who introduces his brother Peter to the Lord Jesus. Saint Andrew is given the name "Protoclete", because in John's Gospel he is the first one chosen by Jesus to be His disciple, therefore the name "First Called" is appropriate. These introductions are of life-changing importance.

Samuel, Andrew and Peter embrace their calling with a confidence which will be made stronger as their relationship with God grows. The Scriptures relate how they grow in their confidence and commitment to follow the Lord in His bidding, however imperfectly. Likewise in today's epistle reading from the Apostle Paul's first correspondence to the Corinthians indicates, these Greek Christians who have been introduced to Christ must now turn from carnal ways and commit themselves to a chaste life as temples of the Holy Spirit.

Introductions are important and open up for us new relationships which can help us grow spiritually into disciples for Christ who is waiting for our positive response to service in His Name. Like Eli, John and Andrew we are also called to introduce the Lord to others by our welcome and invitation to opportunities where faith may be shared. All of us are called into this service which is called evangelization, introduction to Christ.

As we begin the New Year 2024 I am looking forward to YOU helping me in introducing others to Christ and His Church. Let's invite and welcome others! Jesus is calling us to do this!!

ST. SEBASTIAN, Martyr
The Same Day, January 20—Patron of Athletes

St. Sebastian was born at Narbonne in Gaul, educated at Milan, and martyred at Rome about the year 284.

According to an account of the 5th century and now considered unhistorical, he entered the army at Rome under the Emperor Carinus, about the year 283, in order to render assistance to the martyrs. When Diocletian left for the East, St. Sebastian continued to enjoy the esteem of Maximian, his coadjutor in the Empire.

St. Sebastian had prudently concealed his religion, but he was at last detected and accused before Diocletian, who condemned him to be shot to death by arrow. The sentence was executed to the extent that he was left for dead.

Restored to health by the care of a pious widow, he boldly appeared before the Emperor and reproached him for his injustice against the Christians. The Emperor, recovering from his surprise at beholding St. Sebastian alive, commanded that he be beaten to death with clubs. His body was thrown into a sewer; but a pious lady had it privately removed, and buried it in the catacombs.

PRAYER Lord, grant us a spirit of strength. Taught by the glorious example of Your Martyr St. Sebastian, may we learn how to obey You rather than men. Amen
