My dear parishioners,

Today is the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time as we gather to celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on the Lord's Day. The Sacred Texts which are proclaimed to us this Sunday contain the sense of urgency in responding to the Lord's call. In the Old Testament reading the Prophet Jonah announces the message of repentance to the people of Nineveh who respond immediately with fasting and contrition. Their behavior is a compliment to their trust in God's messenger and the message which was announced to them. In the epistle reading the Apostle Paul writes to the Corinthian Christians warning them of the rapid passage of time and that they should not be caught off guard when all comes to a conclusion. Their conduct should correspond to those who look forward to the world to come and that this anticipation must be a constant awareness. The Evangelist Mark records the call by the Lord Jesus to the first four Apostles; Peter and his brother Andrew; James and his brother John, all of them fishermen in Galilee. The Evangelist reports the immediate response of the brothers who leave their family and livelihood to join up with Jesus. We hear of no discussions but are told that "they left" and "followed Him."

The Latin phrase, "momento mori" is translated REMEMBER YOU MUST DIE! Most of us as adults know how true this is and yet we live as if this will not apply to us. We are very good at putting things off especially in regard to our spiritual life, we always feel we have time and can take care of that later. Today we are being reminded that the time to act is NOW because tomorrow may never come. The Apostle Paul reminds us that the time to do something is NOW, "...NOW is a very acceptable time; behold, NOW is the day of salvation." (2 Corinthians 6:2)

The Lord requires an immediate response to His invitation to discipleship and the turning away from former things which keep us from Him. He is calling us to holiness as He did to the citizens of Nineveh and it is the prophetic voice of the Church today announcing the message that we must not delay but rather respond NOW.

Let our response be found in our celebration of the sacraments in which we meet Christ and receive His grace. Let our response be seen in the manner in which we live at home and in the world. Let our participation in good works and charitable acts define us so that we may one day join with Christ in His eternal kingdom.

MOMENTO MORI! The time to respond to God is now!

# ST. ANGELA MERICI, Virgin January 27

Born in 1474 at Desenzano on the shore of Lake Garda, Italy, St. Angela Merici became a tertiary of St. Francis at fifteen years of age. In a vision God revealed to her that she would establish a "company" to promote the welfare of souls. At Desenzano she established a school for the instruction of young girls and a second school at Brescia. She gathered around her twelve religious companions and founded the Ursulines at Brescia.

St. Angela was of a reflective bent and possibly the first to grasp the changed role of women in the society transformed by the Renaissance. She envisaged that those who joined her would remain in the world but devote themselves to every type of corporal and spiritual work of mercy, with special emphasis on education.

However, her idea of education was very different from that of a convent school. She preferred to send her followers to teach girls in their own families. Through this she hoped to effect an improvement in social conditions. For it was her belief that "disorder in society is the result of disorder in the family." Her idea of a religious order of women without distinctive habit and without solemn vows and enclosure was also in advance of her times —although her Order was obliged to adopt the canonical safeguards then required of all nuns.

On November 25, 1535, the solemn canonical institution of the company of St. Ursula took place in the Oratory of the Piazza del Duomo. As a patron, St. Angela chose St. Ursula because ever since her martyrdom, St. Ursula was regarded as the ideal type of Christian virginity.



In the year of her death, 1540, it was estimated that at least half the town of Brescia was Lutheran or Calvinist. However, the schools of the Ursulines did their share in strengthening and extending Catholicism and in safeguarding Italy from what we now term "modern unbelief." She was canonized in 1807 by Pope Pius VII.
