CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY

All Catholic Churches in the United States require from Catholics serving as a Godparent for Baptism or a sponsor for Confirmation a certificate of eligibility. This document certifies that the Godparent/sponsor is a registered member of the parish, attends Holy Mass, approaches the sacraments regularly and contributes to the support of the Church via the Sunday offering envelope program or "WeShare". It is the responsibility of the individual to meet these requirements as listed in the Code of Canon Law, #874.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Arrangements are to be made at least ONE YEAR in advance. The date should not be set until the priest has been consulted.

Living Baptism – (about Sacraments)

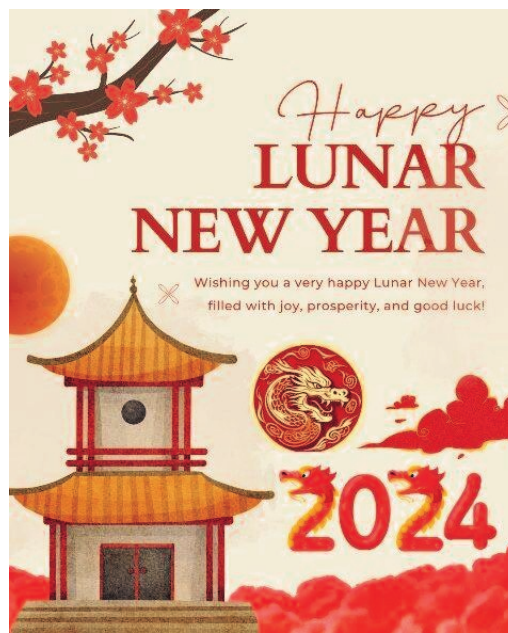
Knowing and Meeting Jesus – (about Scripture)

Church Regulations Regarding Fast and Abstinence:

Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat. Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal on a given fast day. Catholics who are eighteen years of age but not yet fifty-nine are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On fast days, two additional smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength. However, the two smaller meals together may not equal one full meal. Moreover, eating solid foods between meals on fast days is not permitted.

OUR CHILDREN – Children should be accompanied by a parent or adult when using the restrooms in the parish hall. We want to make sure that our children return to Mass promptly and safely. Your cooperation is appreciated.

My dear parishioners,

Today we commemorate the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time as we gather to celebrate the Lord's Day with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. In both the Old Testament and Gospel readings for this Sunday we find the contagion of leprosy, that dreaded disease, which was painful and highly transmittable to others as the topic. As a result, lepers were to be shunned and excluded from the community in fear that others would be infected. Only after careful and ritualized initiatives would one be admitted back into the community after having been exposed to the disease. The sickness of leprosy excluded and segregated so that people could not live together which furthered the pain and suffering.

As we reflect upon leprosy, which today is named Hansen's disease and is treatable, we are mindful of the effects of sin. Sin causes pain and suffering. Sin divides people from living together in harmony. Sin brings fracture to community. Like leprosy, sin can be treated. The sacrament of penance is the antidote. Sin is forgiven and eradicated so that healing and wholeness return to the individual and the community. In today's epistle reading the Apostle Paul writes to the Corinthians about his own efforts in fostering community within the Church. He speaks of promoting solidarity by his good conduct as he tries to imitate the Lord Jesus Christ. You see, like Jesus, Paul becomes a healer and a practitioner of noble practices which seek to strengthen community.

The Christian community is important and its strengthening vital in offering witness to the faith. Of course our primary strength comes from the Eucharistic assembly but also from the various opportunities we have in the life of the parish. This past Friday evening was one such example of our parish community coming together for FOOD, FUN and FAITH in our Madre Gras, Pre-Lenten event. This was a gathering in which we enjoyed one another's company, shared good food and learned about our faith as we are about to enter into the holy season of Lent. Such gatherings as this make Saint Cecilia's strong and galvanizes our community of faith. That is why we need to promote and participate in these events which make us **SAINT CECILIA STRONG!** Indifference to community gatherings weaken and causes fracture which allows sin to enter. On Wednesday we begin the holy season of Lent, a spiritual springtime in which we hope to experience conversion and renewal. I pray that you will all join with me and Father Matt as we "roll up our sleeves" and do the spiritual work of PRAYER, FASTING and ALMSGIVING during these 40 days! May our parish community be united in our determination to observe Lent this year!

**ST. VALENTINE, Priest and Martyr
The Same Day, February 14 – Patron of Greetings**

ST. VALENTINE, a Roman priest, together with St. Marius and his family, assisted the martyrs who suffered during the reign of Emperor Claudius II in the 3rd century. Being apprehended, he was sent to the Prefect of Rome, who commanded that he be beaten with clubs and afterward beheaded. He suffered martyrdom about the year 270.

The custom of sending valentines on this day is the revival of an ancient pagan practice, which consisted of boys drawing the names of girls in honor of their goddess, Februa Juno, on February 15. To abolish this practice names of Saints were substituted on billets and drawn upon this day.

PRAYER: God of power and mercy, through Your help St. Valentine has overcome the tortures of his passion. Help us who celebrate his triumph to remain victorious over the wiles of our enemies. Amen
