CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY

All Catholic Churches in the United States require from Catholics serving as a Godparent for Baptism or a sponsor for Confirmation a certificate of eligibility. This document certifies that the Godparent/sponsor is a registered member of the parish, attends Holy Mass, approaches the sacraments regularly and contributes to the support of the Church via the Sunday offering envelope program or "WeShare". It is the responsibility of the individual to meet these requirements as listed in the Code of Canon Law, #874.

**Church Regulations Regarding Fast and Abstinence:**

Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat. Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal on a given fast day. Catholics who are eighteen years of age but not yet fifty-nine are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On fast days, two additional smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength. However, the two smaller meals together may not equal one full meal. Moreover, eating solid foods between meals on fast days is not permitted.

LENTEN RETREAT – This year's parish Lenten retreat will take place on Saturday, March 9th beginning with the 8 o'clock morning Mass followed by breakfast in Hayes Hall and the start of the morning reflection. The registration fee is \$25 per person and must be made by calling the parish office (973.627.0313) and mailing in the registration flyer to the office with the check made payable to: St. Cecilia Rosary Society no later than Monday, March 4th. This year's theme is "The Holy Triduum and the Mystery of God's Love" which will be given by Father Matt and Jim Clancy. Copies of the retreat flyer may be found on the table in the church vestibule.

CONFESSIONS – All of us are invited to receive the sacrament of penance during the season of Lent. Confessions are held every Monday evening from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm as well as prior to the Saturday evening Vigil Masses. A Lenten penance service will take place on Wednesday, March 20th at 7:00 pm. Eight priests will be available to hear confessions for both adults and young people. The church requires all the faithful to receive the sacraments of penance and Eucharist during the Easter season which is commonly called "Easter Duty".

SAINT JOSEPH NOVENA – The novena to Saint Joseph will begin in our parish on Sunday, March 10th which leads up to the Solemnity of Saint Joseph on March 19th. The novena will be prayed at the conclusion of the 8 o'clock morning mass every day. The traditional blessing of "Saint Joseph Pastries" will take place in Hayes Hall immediately following the 8 o'clock morning Mass on the Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Tuesday-March 19th during which time a brief program will take place with a presentation given by Dr. Anthony Pane. All are welcome to attend this reception.

My dear parishioners,

Today is the Second Sunday of Lent as we gather to celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass to commemorate the Lord's Day. The Scripture texts which are given to us raise our minds to the meaning of sacrifice which is one of the predominate themes during this holy season. The story from the book of Genesis tells of the lengths to which Abraham will go, even to the point of sacrificing his only son, to show his love for the Almighty. The pericope from the Epistle to the Romans likewise speaks of God's great love for us by sacrificing His only Son so that we might experience the joy of His Holy Resurrection. Each year on the Second Sunday of Lent the lectionary conveys the story of our Lord's Holy Transfiguration on Mount Tabor which has been the traditional site of this miraculous event in which the Lord Jesus appears speaking, in glory, with the Prophets Moses and Elijah. This theophany occurred as the Lord, accompanied by His disciples, was making His way to Jerusalem where He would undergo His passion, death and Resurrection.

SACRIFICE is something we are all familiar with as it is associated with love. To love another person(s) or a cause drives us to endure hardship and pain. We put our needs and comfort as secondary so that which we love may become primary. We sacrifice for our family or perhaps our country in rendering military service. Love compels us!

Our love for the Lord should be allowing us to experience sacrifice during these days of Lent as we recall what God has done out of love for us. During Lent we should know the sacrifice in fasting/abstaining; in giving alms; and by participation in more intense private and public prayer. These things don't come easy in our busy and secular world. It takes a great deal of effort, which can result in much discomfort, to change our lifestyle during these days. Parents have the special duty of introducing and maintaining a Lenten lifestyle at home-which can be a great sacrifice. We do this because LOVE COMPELS US! Reflecting on God's great love for us the Apostle Paul wrote: "He who did not spare His own Son but handed Him over for us all, how will He not also give us everything else along with Him?" The Lord Jesus suffered greatly for love of us and are we not able to sacrifice for love of Him who has won eternal life for us?

Let's sacrifice during Lent! It's a sign of love!

ST. GABRIEL OF OUR LADY OF SORROWS, Cleric
February 27—Patron of Clerics

BORN in 1838, this Saint of modern times was originally named Francis after the great Saint of his native city Assisi. He attended the Jesuit college of Spoleto, where he was a great favorite with his fellow students and professors. Fastidious in manner and dress, he was fond of literature and the theater. However, he decided to leave the world after being miraculously cured from two bouts of illness. He was guided by Our Lady into the Passionist Institute, where he took the name Gabriel and became a veritable Apostle of her Sorrows. At twenty-four years of age he died of tuberculosis, having already attained to a heroic degree of sanctity by a life of self-denial and great devotion to Our Lord's Passion. He was canonized in 1920 by Pope Benedict XV and is the patron of youth, especially of young religious.

His life was without any miraculous event; after his death (in 1862) many miracles occurred at his tomb in Isola di Gran Sasso, Italy.

PRAYER God, You inspired St. Gabriel to strive for perfect charity and so attain Your Kingdom at the end of his pilgrimage on earth. Strengthen us through his intercession that we may advance rejoicing in the way of love. Amen.
