Church Regulations Regarding Fast and Abstinence:

Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat. Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal on a given fast day. Catholics who are eighteen years of age but not yet fifty-nine are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On fast days, two additional smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength. However, the two smaller meals together may not equal one full meal. Moreover, eating solid foods between meals on fast days is not permitted.

<u>DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY</u> – Divine Mercy Sunday is April 7th and will be observed with a special service which will be conducted in our church beginning at 1:30 in the afternoon. We are happy that Derek Nelson and Family will once again lead us in this service in which the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed and the sacrament of penance available to those who would like to receive it. The service will conclude at 3 o'clock, the Hour of Mercy!

My dear parishioners,

Today we enter into the most sacred week of the Christian calendar, HOLY WEEK. It all begins today as we observe Palm Sunday marking the triumphal entry of our Lord Jesus into the city of Jerusalem. The cheers of the people emanate from the Lord's raising of Lazarus from the dead which had previously occurred in Bethany. However the HOSANNA which is sung to the Lord as He enters the holy city will quickly turn to shouts of CRUCIFY HIM in just a few days. This is reflected in the liturgy for Palm Sunday which begins on a jubilant tone but quickly shifts into one which is somber and dark.

Yes, this is a very serious week for us as we remember each day the sufferings which the Lord Jesus endured for our salvation. When we consider the passion He experienced, how could we not want to spend time this week in private prayer and public worship in church? Our brothers and sisters of other faiths will fill their houses of worship. Jews will fill synagogues for the high holy days. Moslems will fill mosques for Ramadan – BUT WHAT ABOUT US? In today's Passion account from the Evangelist Mark we hear of the agony in the garden. Our Lord asks the Apostles to stay awake with Him, to be with Him. However, they fall asleep and He says: "Could you not keep watch for one hour? Watch and pray that you may not undergo the test." So the question becomes, what about you? Can you keep watch with Jesus this week by coming to church for the liturgies which will take place to remember His suffering and death? Others fill their houses of worship and we should do the same because this is an indication of our faith in Him who died so that we might have life.

I pray that parents will accompany their children to church this week and use this time for family instruction in the faith. Fasting and abstaining at home this week, gathering for family prayer, keeping traditions which your family has observed for generations should be a gift that is continued to be passed on to our children. I beg you, please make this week holy!

Father Matt and I look forward to praying with you this week especially on Holy Thursday and Good Friday. The liturgies for these days are very unique and ancient in fidelity to the Church since its earliest days. Jesus still calls out to His disciples: COULD YOU NOT KEEP WATCH FOR ONE HOUR? This week, turn off the TV, get up from the computer and come to the Lord's House so that we might be together as a family of faith.

I assure you of my pastoral love and ardent desire to be with you in church during this week!
