CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY

All Catholic Churches in the United States require from Catholics serving as a Godparent for Baptism or a sponsor for Confirmation a certificate of eligibility. This document certifies that the Godparent/sponsor is a registered member of the parish, attends Holy Mass, approaches the sacraments regularly and contributes to the support of the Church via the Sunday offering envelope program or "WeShare". It is the responsibility of the individual to meet these requirements as listed in the Code of Canon Law, #874.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Arrangements for the Sacrament of Baptism can be made by calling Fr. Matt at extension 15.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Arrangements are to be made at least ONE YEAR in advance. The date should not be set until the priest has been consulted.

My dear parishioners,

CHRIST IS RISEN! This was the greeting which Saint Mary Magdalene spoke to the Apostles on the first Easter Sunday after she had returned from the tomb of Jesus. She was instructed to inform the Apostles of our Lord's holy Resurrection after she and the women disciples went to the tomb only to find it empty. The women disciples testified to this truth by responding to the Resurrection greeting with the words TRULY HE IS RISEN! Christians have been greeting one another with these words during the Easter season from that very first Easter. How wonderful it would be if we would revive this practice today among ourselves!

The Resurrection of Jesus is the foundation of our faith as Christians. The Apostle Paul tells us that if Christ did not rise from the dead then our faith is in vain and we are better than dead. It is because of this event which had taken place on the first day of the week that we keep Sunday holy and refer to it as the Lord's Day. This is the day when death and darkness were defeated. This is the day of LIFE in which the promise of eternal life becomes a reality for all who hope in Christ. The Creator did not make us for death and darkness but to experience the joy of life in His presence.

Every Sunday of the year is a "little Easter." For this reason participation in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is an obligation for us. In recalling the gift of life, we are drawn to be close to our Creator on the first day of the week, every week. Nothing must be more important than attending Holy Mass every Sunday. Parents, the first teachers of religion to their children, must always provide good example regarding Mass attendance. They must see to it that children participate in the Holy Mass and not permit anything to compromise their obligation, including sporting events.

Because of Easter Christians are PRO LIFE! Christ Jesus defeated the evil forces of death in His Resurrection and championed life. As Easter people we partner with Christ in promoting life and defending those whose life is in peril through abortion, euthanasia, doctor-assisted suicide, capital punishment, and war. WE SUPPORT LIFE!

CHRIST IS RISEN-TRULY HE IS RISEN!

ST. VINCENT FERRER, Priest
April 5—Patron of Builders

AT VALENCIA in Spain, this illustrious son of St. Dominic came into the world on January 23, 1357. In the year 1374, he entered the Order of St. Dominic in a monastery near his native city. Soon after his profession he was commissioned to deliver lectures on philosophy. On being sent to Barcelona, he continued his scholastic duties and at the same time devoted himself to preaching.

At Lerida, the famous university cit of Catalonia, he received his doctorate. After this he labored six years in Valencia, during which time he perfected himself in the Christian life. In 1390, he was obliged to accompany Cardinal Pedro de Luna to France, but he soon returned home. When, in 1394, de Luna himself had become Pope at Avignon he summoned St. Vincent and made him master of the sacred palace. In this capacity St. Vincent made unsuccessful efforts to put an end to the great schism. He refused all ecclesiastical dignities, even the cardinal's hat, and only craved to be appointed an apostolic missionary. Now began those labors that made him the famous missionary of the 14th century.

He evangelized nearly every province of Spain, and preached in France, Italy, Germany, Flanders, England, Scotland, and Ireland. Numerous conversions followed his preaching, which God Himself assisted by the gift of miracles. Though the Church was then divided by the great schism, the Saint was honorably received in the districts subject to the two claimants to the Papacy. He was even invited to Mohammedan Granada, where he preached the Gospel with much success. He lived to behold the end of the great schism and the election of Pope Martin V. Finally, crowned with labors, he died April 5, 1419 and was canonized in 1455.

PRAYER God, You raised up St. Vincent Your Priest for a ministry of evangelical preaching. Grant that we may see him reigning in heaven who while on earth proclaimed the future judgment. Amen.

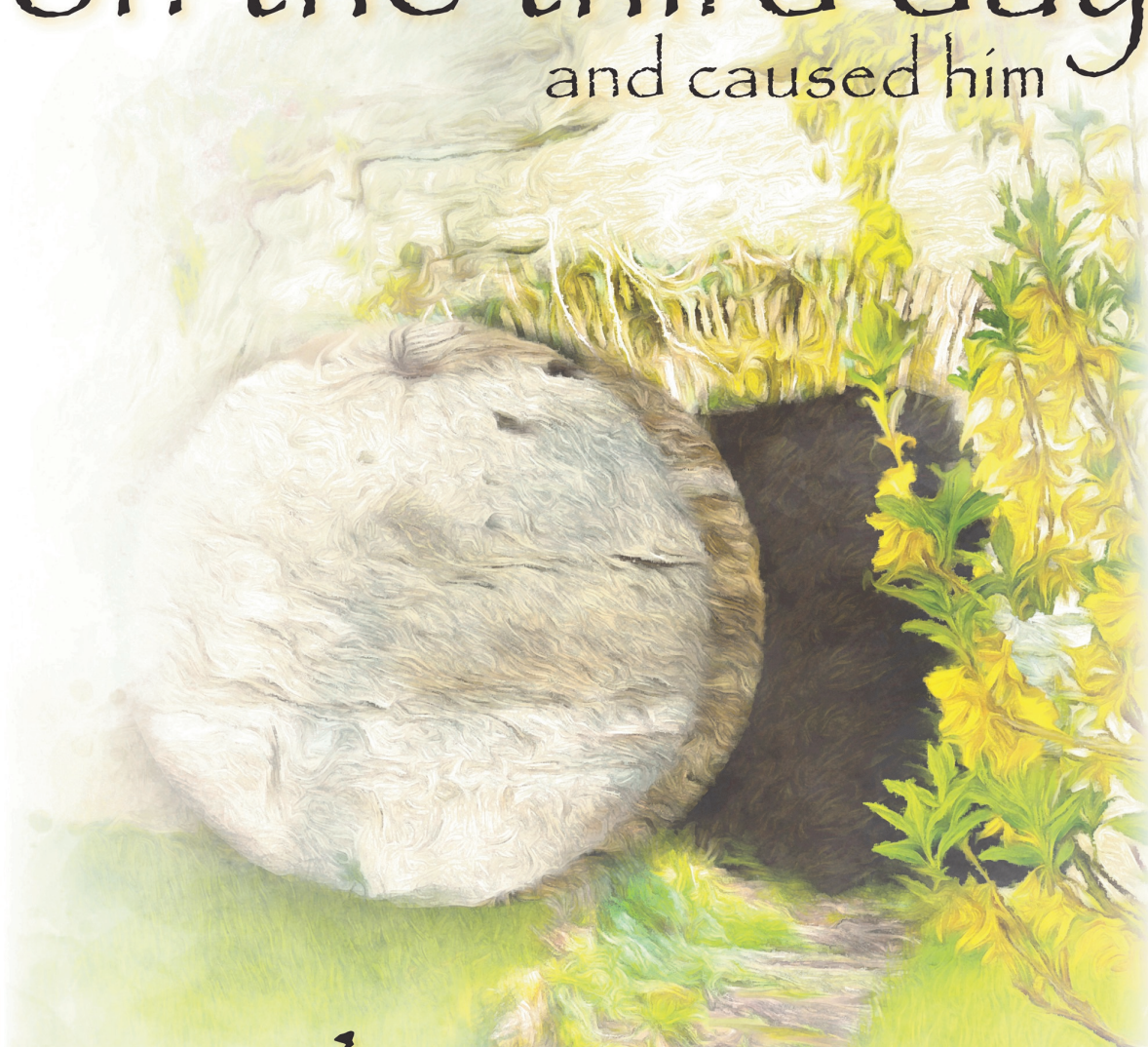
