A SPACE FOR THE HANDICAPPED – Through my pastoral observations and experiences I have concluded that a suitable space is needed in our church for our handicapped parishioners. Accommodation must be made to allow those who use walkers, wheelchairs and other aids to attend Divine Services safely and comfortably. At the recent meeting of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops the hierarchs reaffirmed their concern that the disabled to be part of the worshipping community and that every effort should be made to accommodate them. I have met with the company which services our pews and have agreed with their proposal that the first pew on the right side (Altar of Saint Joseph) be altered. The entire first seat will be removed so as to provide sufficient access for walkers and wheelchairs. Signage will indicate that this pew is reserved for the handicapped only! This work will begin in the next few weeks. - Father Zig

My dear parishioners,

Today we are commemorating the Ascension of Our Lord into Heaven. This event, according to the Evangelist Luke, took place on the 40th day after the Resurrection of our Lord (a Thursday) as we hear in today's reading from the Acts of the Apostles. The Bishops of the Province of Newark, the five Latin dioceses in New Jersey, have transferred this feast to the Seventh Sunday of Easter as is the case in much of the United States. Therefore, last Thursday was not a holy day of obligation as some have inquired.

As noted above, today's first Scriptural reading gives us information of the Lord Jesus' return to heaven after appearing to His disciples over the course of 40 days assuring them of His victory over death. As He departs from their sight the disciples are instructed to pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit who will empower them to be witnesses to Jesus in all that He said and did. The coming of the Holy Spirit became reality on Pentecost Sunday filling those gathered in the Upper Room with divine gifts enabling them to witness to the Risen Christ. Out into the streets they went no longer afraid but now fearless in their testimony.

At the Ascension the disciples are instructed to "Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature." These are the "marching orders" Jesus gave to the Apostles and that they did! As the Apostles went forth after Pentecost bringing the good news of salvation they encountered not only acceptance but also hateful rejection. Holy Tradition tells us that although martyred for their faith, their evangelical work brought forth a rich harvest in various parts of the world. The message of the Ascension is, "why are you standing there looking at the sky" but rather "Go...and proclaim the Gospel..." This is the task that the Lord Jesus not only gave to the Apostles but He has charged us with this same work. This work was challenging for the Apostles and so it is with us as well. Our secular culture is no more welcoming of the Gospel as was the Roman world of the First Century and yet the Gospel prevailed. So too must we be faithful in our mission of witnessing to Christ today among our relatives, neighbors, coworkers and all whom we meet. Again, like the Apostles, we too have been gifted with the Holy Spirit at Baptism and those gifts have been sealed within us at Confirmation to assist us in bringing Christ to all. So don't be afraid-GIVE CHRISTIAN WITNESS!!

COME HOLY SPIRIT; FILL THE HEARTS OF THE FAITHFUL! Father Zig

ST. DYMPHNA, Virgin and Martyr Patronese of the Mentally III—May 15

St. Dymphna was born in the 7th century. Her father, Damon, a chieftain of great wealth and power, was a pagan. Her mother was a very beautiful and devout Christian.

Dymphna was fourteen when her mother died. Damon is said to have been afflicted with a mental illness, brought on by his grief. He sent messengers throughout his own and other lands to find some woman of noble birth, resembling his wife, who would be willing to marry him. When none could be found, his evil advisers told him to marry his own daughter. Dymphna fled from her castle together with St. Gerebran, her confessor, and two other friends.

Damon found them in Belgium. He gave orders that the priest's head be cut off. Then Damon tried to persuade his daughter to return to Ireland with him. When she refused, he drew his sword and struck off her head. She was then only fifteen years of age.

Dymphna received the crown of martyrdom in defense of her purity about the year 620. She is the patron of those suffering from nervous and mental afflictions. Many miracles have taken place at her shrine, built on the spot where she was buried in Gheel, Belgium.

PRAYER Hear us, O God, our Savior, as we honor St. Dymphna, patron of those afflicted with mental and emotional illness. Help us to be inspired by her example and comforted by her merciful help. Amen.


