

A grant would significantly reduce the cost which we would have to contribute.) 

A SPACE FOR THE HANDICAPPED – Through my pastoral observations and experiences I have concluded that a suitable space is needed in our church for our handicapped parishioners. Accommodation must be made to allow those who use walkers, wheelchairs and other aids to attend Divine Services safely and comfortably. At the recent meeting of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops the hierarchs reaffirmed their concern that the disabled to be part of the worshipping community and that every effort should be made to accommodate them. I have met with the company which services our pews and have agreed with their proposal that the first pew on the right side (Altar of Saint Joseph) be altered. The entire first seat will be removed so as to provide sufficient access for walkers and wheelchairs. Signage will indicate that this pew is reserved for the handicapped only! This work will begin in the next few weeks. - Father Zig

My dear parishioners,

Today we mark the 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Scripture readings for this Sunday have a common theme which has to do with planting. By now those of you who keep a garden of flowers and vegetables have a while back planted the seeds which have already germinated and are showing themselves as having been transformed. This Sunday we are being asked to consider God's all powerful word which can transform to a glorious state.

The Prophet Ezekiel testifies to God's power to transform a shoot into a grand tree which surpasses all the other trees of the forest. This mighty tree, planted by God, is splendid and adorned like no other tree. This is a tree whose loftiness and grandeur cannot be unnoticed, is a symbol of integrity brought about by the power of God's word.

In the Gospel parable the Lord Jesus reminds His listeners how seed planting reveals an image of the mystery of the Kingdom of God. Jesus says that a very tiny seed is filled with such potential that it can grow into a large bush which can accommodate the birds of the air. This too is a symbol of the power of God's mighty word, transformative in every way imaginable.

Even in today's epistle reading from the second correspondence of the Apostle Paul to the Corinthians we find evidence of the power of God's word. Readers are reminded that in burial of death there is a harvest home which awaits believers. God's word has assured us of the eternal life awaiting the just and righteous. As the Gospel Acclamation for this Sunday says: "The seed is the word of God, Christ is the sower. All who come to Him will live forever."

God's word is life-altering and if we have a receptive heart we will be able to produce a grand harvest of good works. This is the harvest which will accompany us into the presence of God when we pass from this life into eternity – and that's all that matters!

On Tuesday I am leaving for a week's vacation in Rome and will return next Thursday. Arrivederci!

GLORY TO JESUS CHRIST-GLORY FOREVER! Father Zig

ST. PAULINUS OF NOLA, Bishop June 22

BORN in 353 at Bordeaux, Gaul, of a senatorial family, St. Paulinus was educated under the poet Ausonius, and became governor of the province of Campania. He married a Spanish Christian lady named Therasia and for fifteen years displayed his talents in honorable employments in Gaul, Italy, and Spain. His conversations with St. Ambrose at Milan, St. Martin whom he met at Vienne, and St. Delphinus, Bishop of Bordeaux, resulted in his being baptized by the latter in 390.

After the death of his only child he and his wife took a vow of chastity, gave away their considerable wealth, and retired to Spain to embrace the religious life. In 394, he was ordained in Barcelona at the insistence of the people, and together with his wife settled at Nola, Italy, near the tomb of St. Felix, where they founded a home for monks and the poor and lived a very austere life. Because of his widespread reputation for holiness, he was made Bishop of Nola in 409.

His sanctity brought St. Paulinus in contact with the most eminent Saints of his time, such as Augustine and the ones already mentioned above. He had an intense devotion to the saints and respect for their relics. His poetic works, many of them in honor of St. Felix, place him beside Prudentius as the foremost Christian Latin poet of the patristic age. He died in 431.

PRAYER God, You willed that St. Paulinus, Your Bishop, should shine forth with pastoral solicitude and compassion for the poor. Help us who celebrate his merits to imitate the example of his charity. Amen.
