

BE PREPARED – The air conditioning system in the church is on its last leg! The system is functioning with only one unit with the other two units unrepairable. Estimates is that a new AC system for the church will run about \$65,000, money which we do not have. (There is some good news however; I am awaiting word from an organization which gives grants to non profits to update their aging systems for a more efficient one. A grant would significantly reduce the cost which we would have to contribute.) With this being said, should the temperature become very uncomfortable in the church, Holy Mass will take place in Hayes Hall which is on a separate and more modern AC system. – Father Zig

A SPACE FOR THE HANDICAPPED – Through my pastoral observations and experiences I have concluded that a suitable space is needed in our church for our handicapped parishioners. Accommodation must be made to allow those who use walkers, wheelchairs and other aids to attend Divine Services safely and comfortably. At the recent meeting of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops the hierarchs reaffirmed their concern that the disabled to be part of the worshipping community and that every effort should be made to accommodate them. I have met with the company which services our pews and have agreed with their proposal that the first pew on the right side (Altar of Saint Joseph) be altered. The entire first seat will be removed so as to provide sufficient access for walkers and wheelchairs. Signage will indicate that this pew is reserved for the handicapped only! This work will begin in the next few weeks. - Father Zig

My dear parishioners,

Today is the Lord's Day and the 13<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Sacred texts which are presented for our reflection this Sunday speak about death and life. The Old Testament Book of Wisdom affirms that, "God did not make death, nor does He rejoice in the destruction of the living..." God is the Creator, He brings about life but unfortunately we have become the promoters of death. Just look at our society today with such an anti life agenda which includes abortion, euthanasia, physician-assisted suicide, capital punishment and the list goes on!

In today's lengthy Gospel reading we see how Jesus is the promoter of health and well being. He is the One who restores life to those who have died. For your sake, he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich."

Our Creator God has given us the great gift of life and so we value every human life knowing how precious it is in the eyes of God. Death came as a result of sin through the influence of the Devil. Satan is the promoter of death and his cohorts are those who are not PRO LIFE! Pro Choice is Pro Death!

We attend the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass every Sunday because Sunday is the day of Resurrection, the day when the Lord Jesus conquered death. Maybe that's one of the reasons why church attendance is down because so many people are not PRO LIFE. Because so many people promote policies in our society which champion death, the weekly celebration of the Lord Jesus' victory over death is something which they are not interested in because death is more appealing. THAT'S STRANGE and TERRIFYING!

The Lord's Day is the great day of rejoicing, the day when life trampled down death. Our participation in the Holy Mass every Sunday says, "I will praise you Lord, for you have rescued me!"

# ST. ELIZABETH OF PORTUGAL July 4 – Patroness of Third Order of St. Francis

THE father of St. Elizabeth was Peter III, King of Aragon. She came into the world at the royal palace in Saragossa in 1271, and received the name of Elizabeth after her aunt, St. Elizabeth of Hungary, who several years before had been canonized by Pope Gregory IX.

Her grandfather, James I, who then occupied the throne of Aragon, took upon himself the care of her education, but he died before she was six years of age. Her early years were spent in the most extraordinary piety and at the age of twelve she was given in marriage to Dionysius, King of Portugal. However, her husband left her free to practice her devotions, and she lived on the throne with the virtue and regularity of a Religious. Eventually, her patience and gentleness succeeded in converting the King, who had been leading a licentious life. Charity to the poor was one of her characteristic virtues, and her works for the good of her fellowmen knew no bounds.

Her virtue also had to pass through the crucible of suffering. One of the keenest pangs she endured came from the revolt of her son, Alfonso, against his own father, and the unjust treatment of the latter, who suspected her of favoring his son. The King, however, soon acknowledged his error and made amends, and the saintly woman succeeded in effecting a reconciliation between father and son.

After the death of her husband she took the habit of the Third Order of St. Francis and retired to a convent of Poor Clares, near which she dwelt in a house she had erected. Hearing that her son, Alphonsus IV, King of Portugal, had gone to war with her grandson, Alfonso IX, King of Castile, she set out on a journey to reconcile them and succeeded. This was her last act of mercy, for having arrived at Estremoz, on the frontiers of Castile where her son was, she fell ill. After receiving the Last Sacraments, she died on July 4, 1336, and was canonized in 1625 by Pope Urban VIII.

PRAYER God, Author and Lover of charity, You endowed St. Elizabeth with the wondrous grace of bringing dissidents together. Through her intercession enable us to practice works of peace so that we may be called children of God. Amen.
