

BE PREPARED – The air conditioning system in the church is on its last leg! The system is functioning with only one unit with the other two units unrepairable. Estimates is that a new AC system for the church will run about \$65,000, money which we do not have. (There is some good news however; I am awaiting word from an organization which gives grants to non profits to update their aging systems for a more efficient one. A grant would significantly reduce the cost which we would have to contribute.) With this being said, should the temperature become very uncomfortable in the church, Holy Mass will take place in Hayes Hall which is on a separate and more modern AC system. – Father Zig



WHEN A PRIEST IS NEEDED—When a family member is sick and in need of a priest for the sacraments please call the parish office so that a priest will be notified of the request. ON THE WEEKENDS, HOLIDAYS AND EVENINGS AFTER OFFICE HOURS, PLEASE CALL THE EMERGENCY NUMBER (862-251-3914) AND LEAVE YOUR NAME AND PHONE NUMBER CLEARLY AND A PRIEST WILL RESPOND. Please note that the hospital does not call the parish office to notify the priest if a parishioner is admitted. This becomes the families responsibility.

A SPACE FOR THE HANDICAPPED - Through my pastoral observations and experiences I have concluded that a suitable space is needed in our church for our handicapped parishioners. Accommodation must be made to allow those who use walkers, wheelchairs and other aids to attend Divine Services safely and comfortably. At the recent meeting of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops the hierarchs reaffirmed their concern that the disabled to be part of the worshipping community and that every effort should be made to accommodate them. I have met with the company which services our pews and have agreed with their proposal that the first pew on the right side (Altar of Saint Joseph) be altered. The entire first seat will be removed so as to provide sufficient access for walkers and wheelchairs. Signage will indicate that this pew is reserved for the handicapped only! This work will begin in the next few weeks. - Father Zig

<u>LOW GLUTEN</u> – Those who cannot tolerate wheat products can receive the Holy Eucharist via a low gluten host which is approved by the National Conference of Catholic Bishops. Person(s) must make themselves identified to the priest no later than 10 minutes before Mass begins by going to the priest sacristy so that the preparation may be made for Mass.

My dear parishioners,

We commemorate the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time as we gather to celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on the Lord's Day. Today the vocation of disciple-prophet is being presented to us and specifically the call to speak in the Lord's Name. The task is one which many times is met with insults and derision by strangers and relatives. This is apparent in today's Gospel with the rejection of Jesus as He speaks to those of His home town. They want to "cut him down to their own size" as they say, "who does he think he is speaking to us like this?" They reject His words and they refuse to believe in Him for which they are at a loss because Jesus is unable to perform any miracles there because of "their lack of faith."

As previously noted the prophetic vocation is not a glamorous one but rather one which produces pain and a sense of power-lessness. This is evident in the words the Apostle Paul wrote in his second correspondence to the Church in Corinth. He reminds himself, and shares with his listeners the words which the Lord spoke to comfort him, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." The Apostle Paul comes to realize that the vocation to which God has called him will be one in which the Lord will not abandon him but will rather uphold him. Paul testifies, "Therefore, I am content with weakness, insults, hardships, persecutions, and constraints, for the sake of Christ; for when I am weak, then I am strong."

Recalling the Old Testament reading we find the Prophet Ezekiel being deputized by God and commissioned to go and speak in the Name of the Lord. He is forewarned that his proclamation will not be accepted by all but that the message must be announced so that truth may become evident to the righteous.


This Sunday's Scriptures remind us of our prophetic vocation which was given to us at baptism when the priest anointed us with Sacred Chrism and said, "He (God) now anoints you with the chrism of salvation. As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet and King, so may you live always as a member of His body, sharing everlasting life." YOU and I share in the vocation of prophet! We are charged with the task of testifying to the truth and proclaiming the Gospel. This is not an easy assignment. We will be humiliated by both family and strangers to upholding Christ AND His teachings in our secular culture. It will be uneasy at times and painful at others but it's the mission we have been given. Know that we stand in good company with the Lord Jesus, the Apostle Paul and the Prophet Ezekiel so there is nothing to fear accept the loss of heaven. So go out and WIT-NESS, SPEAK THE TRUTH WITH LOVE!

GLORY TO JESUS CHRIST-GLORY FOREVER! Father Zig

St. Kateri Tekakwitha, Virgin July 14

KATERI was born near the town of Auriesville, New York, in the year 1656, the daughter of a Mohawk warrior. She was four years old when her mother died of smallpox. The disease also attacked Kateri and transfigured her face. She was adopted by her two aunts and an uncle.

Kateri became converted as a teenager. She was baptized at the age of twenty and incurred the great hostility of her tribe. Although she had to suffer greatly for her Faith, she remained firm in it. Kateri went to the new Christian colony of Indians in Canada. Here she lived a life dedicated to prayer, penitential practices, and care for the sick and aged. Every morning, even in bitterest winter, she stood before the chapel door until it opened at four and remained there until after the last Mass. She was devoted to the Eucharist and to Jesus Crucified. She died on April 7, 1680, at the age of twenty-four. She is known as the "Lily of the Mohawks."



PRAYER Lord, You called the Virgin, Blessed Kateri, to shine forth among the Indian people as an example of purity of life. Grant, through her intercession, that all peoples of every tribe, tongue, and nation, may be gathered into Your Church and proclaim Your greatness in one song of praise. Amen.
