CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY

All Catholic Churches in the United States require from Catholics serving as a Godparent for Baptism or a sponsor for Confirmation a certificate of eligibility. This document certifies that the Godparent/sponsor is a registered member of the parish, attends Holy Mass, approaches the sacraments regularly and contributes to the support of the Church via the Sunday offering envelope program or "WeShare". It is the responsibility of the individual to meet these requirements as listed in the Code of Canon Law, #874.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Arrangements are to be made at least ONE YEAR in advance. The date should not be set until the priest has been consulted.

JULY 28 – The 5 o’clock Sunday Mass in Vietnamese will not take place on July 28th. The regular schedule resumes next week.

A SPACE FOR THE HANDICAPPED – Through my pastoral observations and experiences I have concluded that a suitable space is needed in our church for our handicapped parishioners. Accommodation must be made to allow those who use walkers, wheelchairs and other aids to attend Divine Services safely and comfortably. At the recent meeting of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops the hierarchs reaffirmed their concern that the disabled to be part of the worshipping community and that every effort should be made to accommodate them. I have met with the company which services our pews and have agreed with their proposal that the first pew on the right side (Altar of Saint Joseph) be altered. The entire first seat will be removed so as to provide sufficient access for walkers and wheelchairs. Signage will indicate that this pew is reserved for the handicapped only! This work will begin in the next few weeks. – Father Zig

My dear parishioners,

Today we observe the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time as we celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on the Lord's Day. The popular Scriptural image of the shepherd appears in both the Old Testament and Gospel readings for this week as well as in the Responsorial Psalm and Alleluia Verse. In the Old Testament the King of Israel was likened to a shepherd who would lead the people of the nation by providing care for them and keeping them from harm. Unfortunately there were kings who presented themselves not as shepherds but as "wolves in sheep's clothing." Such kings were only concerned about their own well being and were indifferent to the people whom they were called to love. In today's pericope from the Book of the Prophet Jeremiah the Lord comes to the rescue of Israel and promises that He will "raise up" shepherds who will be of the Lord's making. A Good Shepherd will come forth from the "righteous shoot of David" who will lead all to the everlasting pastures of heaven.

In the Gospel we find the Lord Jesus meeting with the Apostles after they returned from their missionary journey. They were sent on this journey to be good shepherds caring for those whom they encountered by ministering to them in word and deed. They appear tired from ministry and the Lord encourages them to now rest from their labors. He invites them to spend time with Him away from the people to be recharged and refreshed. We see in this pericope how ministry is intense and that rest is needed so as to resume the work to which the shepherd has been called to perform in Jesus Name. However, Jesus being the Good Shepherd sees the people who have followed after Him and the Apostles. His sacred heart overflows with compassion "and He began to teach them many things."

Of course we can see how these texts speak to the role of those in ordained ministry in the sacrament of holy orders. These have been called by the Lord to give of themselves in imitation of Jesus the Good Shepherd. We have so many good and holy deacons, priests and bishops who untiringly give of themselves every day. Unfortunately, we are very aware of the scandal and shame brought to the Church by those who were "wolves in sheep's clothing" who abused and molested those they were called to love. We pray for these victims and recommit ourselves to vigilance as the Church which Christ established on earth. In closing I draw your attention to the yellow insert of this Sunday's bulletin which addresses the serious subject of abuse. Please read it through and let us all be aware of the responsibility we have to provide a safe environment for all people, young and old, who come onto our parish property. Jesus, the Good Shepherd demands this of us!

ST. MARY MAGDALENE

July 22

ST. MARY, whom Jesus converted, and who witnessed His last moments with Mary, His Mother, and St. John, was called Magdalene from the town of Magdala in Galilee. Clement of Alexandria and others identify her with the woman who washed Jesus' feet with her tears. Others regard her as Mary, the Sister of Martha and Lazarus. She followed Jesus with other devout women during His Public Life. After His Resurrection, Jesus appeared first to Mary Magdalene and then to His Apostles.

It is an ancient tradition in Provence, France, that St. Mary Magdalene or Mary the sister of Lazarus, together with Lazarus, Martha, and some other disciples of our Lord, being expelled by the Jews, put to sea and landed at Marseilles; and that St. Lazarus became the first Bishop of that See.

The feast of St. Mary Magdalene is celebrated by the Greeks as well as the Latins on this date. However, in the instructions given with the latest edition of the Roman Calendar, the Latin Church has stipulated that the feast is solely that of the woman to whom Christ appeared and not that of the sister of Lazarus or the penitent woman.



PRAYER God, it was to St. Mary Magdalene before all others that Your Son committed the message of Easter joy. Through her intercession may we one day contemplate Him reigning in glory. Amen

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
