

A SPACE FOR THE HANDICAPPED - Through my pastoral observations and experiences I have concluded that a suitable space is needed in our church for our handicapped parishioners. Accommodation must be made to allow those who use walkers, wheelchairs and other aids to attend Divine Services safely and comfortably. At the recent meeting of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops the hierarchs reaffirmed their concern that the disabled to be part of the worshipping community and that every effort should be made to accommodate them. I have met with the company which services our pews and have agreed with their proposal that the first pew on the right side (Altar of Saint Joseph) be altered. The entire first seat will be removed so as to provide sufficient access for walkers and wheelchairs. Signage will indicate that this pew is reserved for the handicapped only! This work will begin in the next few weeks. - Father Zig

My dear parishioners,

We have assembled in our church for the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on this 17<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel reading for the next five weeks will come from the 6<sup>th</sup> chapter of the Gospel of Saint John known as "the Bread of Life Discourse." The chapter begins with the miraculous feeding of the multitude of people (5,000 in number) with only five barley loaves and two fish. This miracle performed by the Lord Jesus is recorded in all four Gospels and is an indication to us of the importance of this event by the Early Church. It is important because it points to the Holy Eucharist which the Church celebrated from its earliest days. The Eucharist is the real presence of Jesus among us: body, soul and divinity. In the real presence of Christ in the Most Blessed Sacrament we find the source of our unity in faith. In today's epistle reading from the Letter to the Ephesians the Apostle Paul reminds us of this communion we share with one another. As baptized believers we share the Eucharist because we share a common faith, it is the faith which comes to us from the Apostles.

In both the Old Testament reading from the Second Book of Kings and the Gospel we read that the Lord provided bread for the people from a small amount. The Lord did not want the people to become famished as they journeyed so He miraculously provided nourishment from an apparently simple source. The Catholic Church and the Churches of the East have always seen the Holy Eucharist as the Lord Jesus among us, the sacrament which we worship and adore. We also see in both Scripture readings that the remnants of what was miraculously confected was gathered up and not discarded. So too with us, the Eucharist which remains after the liturgy is reverently reserved in the tabernacle to be given to the sick as well as for adoration within the church.

#### ST. LAWRENCE, Martyr August 10—Patron of the Poor and of Cooks

In 257, when St. Sixtus became Pope, he ordained St. Lawrence deacon, and though he was still young appointed him the first of the seven deacons who served in the Church of Rome. To this office was annexed the care of the treasury of the Church and the distribution of its revenues among the poor. In that same year, the Emperor Valerian published his edict of persecution and commanded all Bishops, priests, and deacons to be put to death immediately. St. Sixtus was arrested twelve months later. As the holy man was led to execution, St. Lawrence followed him in tears. Sixtus at the same time ordered him to distribute the treasures of the Church among the poor. St. Lawrence did as he was commanded, selling even the sacred vessels to increase the sum.

At that time the Church of Rome, besides providing for its ministers, maintained fifteen hundred poor people and even sent alms to distant countries. The Prefect of Rome commanded St. Lawrence to surrender the treasures of the Church, and he promised to show them to him. On the third day, instead of gold and silver he exhibited the poor whom he had gathered together.

The enraged Prefect commanded that he should be slowly roasted on a gridiron. The order was mercilessly executed but the martyr, strengthened by Divine grace, endured his suffering with heroic fortitude and even found strength to jest at the expense of his torments and his persecutor. To his last breath the holy deacon prayed for the conversion of the city of Rome, that the Faith of Christ might thence spread throughout the world. Several senators, who had witnessed his execution, were converted to Christianity and gave decent burial to his body. His martyrdom occurred in the year 258.

PRAYER God, by his ardent love for You St. Lawrence exhibited faithful service and attained a glorious martyrdom. Help us to love what he loved and to practice what he taught. Amen.
